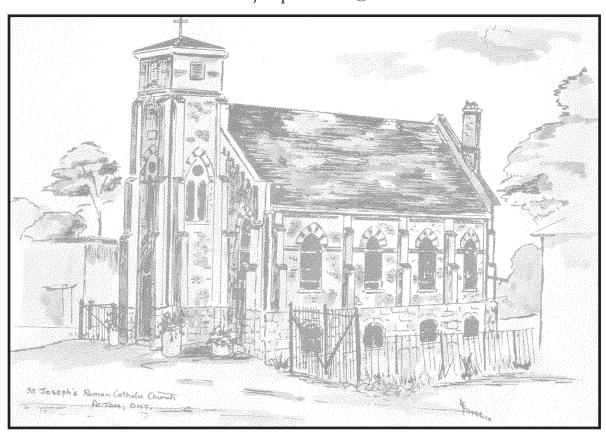

A Word From Our Pastor:

his year we are celebrating a 'leap year', something we experience every four years. Hopefully this leap year will be a better one than the last one in 2020 which came with a global pandemic.

I have always found February 29th very fascinating. A friend of mine once introduced me to an aunt of his who happened to mention that her birthday was coming up and that it was February 29th. I asked her what day she celebrated her birthday when it was not a leap year. She told me she chose February 28th because it is the last day of February.

Many people would not realize that the development of leap year/leap day that we celebrate today is a Catholic creation. In 1582, Pope Gregory XIII after consulting with his advisors and astronomers determined that the extra day was needed. The astronomers calculated that in a normal year time was a little off. They figured that the year was off by a few hours.

Many people would have assumed that it was not a serious matter and thought that nothing needed to be done. However, the astronomers knew that those few extra hours would mount up as the years went on and therefore a correction was needed.

Pope Gregory accepted their findings and declared that a new calendar was to be created. The Gregorian calendar is the one we use to this day. The astronomers also determined that if these extra hours were accounted for, we would in a few hundred years be celebrating Easter in the middle of summer! Easter had already been set at the Council of Nicaea in 325 and it would always be celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon after the Spring Equinox (March 21). This year for example the first full moon is on Monday March 25th, and this makes Easter Sunday March 31st. It is one of those years when Easter is earlier than normal.

When February 29th rolls around, there will be many quirky customs and interesting fun facts about this date. Even in the Catholic world we have some facts about leap day. St. Oswald, an English Bishop has his feast day on February 29th because he died on this day in 992. Tradition has it that he died suddenly while washing the feet of 12 of his people which was a custom that he always performed during the Lenten season.

What about us this upcoming leap day? We have this extra time given to us this year. Many people will complain that they do not have enough time to finish projects or meet deadlines. What is there to do with this gift of time, of an extra day? Is the day going to come and go like any other day? Time, and for that matter, life, can be such great gifts. For me personally, I will be at St. Benedict's Parish in Milton hearing first Confessions for Grade 2 children. A wonderful opportunity to help these children celebrate this sacrament for the first time.

As February 29th approaches, let us use this extra day wisely. Let us make a 'leap' of faith in growing closer to God and praising Him in our lives.

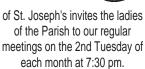
