

A Word From Our Pastor:

his upcoming week we celebrate the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, which is on January 25th. It is also the beginning of what is called the 'dead of Winter'. This season ends four weeks later, on February 22nd with the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter.

There are many who see this time as the most depressing of the entire year. The weather is cold, the days are short regarding light. Perhaps people are recovering from the Christmas Season being over. There are many reasons to feel depressed at this time of year.

We as Catholics should try to remember the upcoming Feast Day of St. Paul in terms of what we can ponder and hope for on this Feast Day. The late Pope Benedict XVI reminded the faithful on numerous occasions of the beauty and joy of this Feast Day.

In one of his Wednesday audiences, the Holy Father spoke specifically about the heart of Paul's conversion: "The Risen Christ appeared as a brilliant light and spoke to Saul, transforming Paul's thinking and his entire life. "The dazzling radiance of the Risen Christ blinded Paul, thus, what was his inner reality is also outwardly apparent, his blindness to the truth, to the light that is Christ. And then his definitive 'yes' to Christ in Baptism restores his sight and makes him really see". (September 3rd, 2008)

In the ancient Church, baptism was also called 'illumination' because baptism gives light. Paul, healed of his inner blindness, saw clearly. Through this event, Paul would never be able to doubt the presence of the Risen Christ because of the powerful evidence of this encounter. It truly was a conversion.

With this Feast Day in mind, today we begin exploring the Gospel of Mark which we will hear for most of this Liturgical year. In today's Gospel passage, we are given the Gospel's two simple themes: telling us who Jesus is and what our response should be. Jesus came to call us to reform our lives. Just as the Israelites had to change their understanding of God in the first reading, so do we. We need an experience of the risen Lord as Paul experienced, one which can utterly transform us. The response of Paul to Jesus' presence, the response that Jesus asks of us, is discipleship, a way of living that is clearly contrary to the way our culture calls us to live. Mark presents Andrew, Peter, James, and John as being so instantly attracted to Jesus that they leave everything to follow Him. And yet, we will learn that despite their radical departure, they did not understand what Jesus would teach them. At some points throughout the Gospels, they attempted to try to talk Jesus out of His mission.

We must take up the challenge to meet and experience Christ in such a way that we, through our own conversions, become more like Paul who could never doubt Christ through his own conversion. Also, just like the Apostles, who, despite their lack of understanding, stayed faithful anyway. We are called to do the same.
