

A Word From Our Pastor:

he Diocese of Hamilton has designated this Sunday as 'Bible Sunday'. The Diocese has provided numerous articles and study guides to promote the reading and praying of Scripture. One can look up the Diocesan website for further information.

This Sunday is also the Word of God Sunday or Ecumenical Sunday throughout the Church's world. In our town we are blessed to be celebrating 'Unity Sunday' today, where all of the Christian churches in Acton will come together to celebrate our common baptism for the first time in three years.

It is interesting that we celebrate 'Unity' and yet the readings of this Sunday contain elements of conflict. The Second Reading of Paul to the Corinthians in particular, shows real conflict which can show how a church or parish can be divided and may eventually be destroyed. Paul is basically giving the church of Corinth a 'pep talk'.

The people had divided into two groups in the Church, those with wealth and those who were poor or slaves. Paul reminded the people that there is no division or conflict if one is united in Christ. He uses the image of the body, where there are many parts, but Christ must be seen as the head. The Greek people would have understood this image because they were always striving to achieve the perfect body. A defect in the body was seen as being a defect in the person. Paul reminds them that if there is a defect in the community, then it affects the holiness of the unity called by Christ.

It is almost comical to also read where there was an issue in the rivalry between preachers in Corinth. Rhetoric was held in high esteem, and the better the rhetorician, the bigger the following. Paul stresses that people must change their objects or attachments. Their objective must be professing Christ and living in unity with Him. We can see this type of image in our parishes or faith communities. One priest can be popular, or he is a good preacher. He can attract parishioners or followers; however, this priest may be transferred and the priest who comes in next is not as popular and may not be a skilled homilist. The people might start comparing the new priest to the old. I have seen this destroy the priest and divide a parish.

On this 'Unity Sunday', let us remind ourselves that unity is the goal of our faith in Jesus. We must see that in our parishes and with other Christian Faith groups. Christ came to restore unity. This is the Gospel of the Kingdom wherein the body is cured of every disease and illness. It must be seen as being perfect.


