

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

or the last number of years I have developed an interest in gardening. I definitely do not have a 'green thumb' but I have learned some things about flowers. I very much appreciate the knowledge some parishioners have provided to me over the last few years. I feel that flowers and trees are gifts from God.

With gardening comes the inevitable problem of weeds. I am amazed at how fast weeds can grow in one's garden. This summer so far, has been one with a lot of rain and humidity. These are perfect conditions for the growth of weeds. Just a couple of weeks ago I checked the front part of my garden, and I did not notice any significant weeds. On Tuesday, just two days later, I noticed that there were three large weeds surrounding the statue of St. Francis which I have at the front. I could not believe how tall and fast that the weeds had grown. I pulled them out immediately.

In the Gospel this Sunday, we have a passage which describes how destructive weeds can be to a farmer. The weed which Jesus describes is what is known to us as 'bearded darnel'. It is a destructive weed that wraps its roots around the roots of the wheat in competition for water and nutrients. In its early stages of growth, it is identical to wheat. Only when it begins to bear seeds is it easily identifiable. Its seeds must be separated from the wheat because it is quite poisonous. Separating the weed from the wheat could be done only at harvest time.

For us, we may not be at 'harvest time' in the world, however, we might understand that it will be God who will separate the good from the bad, because it is only God who can tell the difference.

Jesus is giving us a lesson in patience and tolerance, in our own lives and in the world. When the people heard the parable, they would have been dumbfounded at the response of the farmer. He decided not to do anything!

In the end, the farmer got his revenge. By not reacting and trying to save his wheat immediately, the farmer saved his wheat. The weeds, which were intended to destroy his crop, could be utilized for other purposes. The farmer did not need to retaliate. He knew that if he waited long enough, the enemy would be revealed for what he was, and the farmer would end up looking all the better.

The themes in this week's Gospel are about exercising patience and showing tolerance until God makes His great gathering on Judgement Day. We share in the task

of revealing the patience of God by forgiving the faults of others. This does not mean cultivating an attitude of indifference towards evil. We must always allow God to be the Final Judge.


