

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

t is hard to believe that we are almost at the half-way point of this year. We have just passed the longest day of the year regarding sunlight on June 21. Today, June 25th, we are reminded that we are exactly six months from Christmas Day! Have you started your Christmas shopping yet?

We are now fully into the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. We celebrate every Sunday until the Solemnity of Christ the King, as being part of this season apart from Sunday August 6th when we celebrate the Transfiguration of Our Lord.

Many will see Ordinary Time as being normal or a typical routine. However, it does not mean normal, it comes from the word 'ordinal' meaning a counting. What we are counting are the Sundays between the great season of the life of Jesus. We just finished the Seasons of Lent and Easter, where we reflected upon the last days of Jesus' life, Hiss Passion, Death, and Resurrection. After Ordinary Time, we celebrate Advent and Christmas, which speak of the coming of Jesus and His presence among us.

During this Ordinary Time, we, the followers of Christ, are challenged to look at ourselves and what we are called to do. What is the mission that has been given to us by Jesus? How do we live it?

We first must overcome our fear to follow Christ and to profess His Name in our lives. The readings this weekend remind us that God is always actively present in our lives. This is the belief that we need if we are to overcome our fear.

Last week we read how Jesus sent out the Twelve telling them to proclaim that "The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand". This weekend we finish the passage and Jesus acknowledges that the road will be difficult, but we should not be afraid as it is a road to Salvation. If we do not face these fears, we will be confronted with the danger

of being denied the Salvation which was offered to us.

On this 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time, let us not be afraid to follow Christ. If the Word of God is to free us to act according to our deeper convictions, then we must pray for the grace to overcome our fears. There are many times in our lives when we need to take comfort in the words of Jesus: "Fear not". Whatever happens, God is always in control. It is His world.


