

A Word From Our Pastor:

his week we come to the end of the Easter Season with the Feast of Pentecost. The word Pentecost is from the Greek word that means 'the fiftieth day'. In its origins, Pentecost was a Jewish feast called 'Shavuot' in Hebrew. This feast commemorates the day God gave the Torah or Law to the Israelites at Mount Sinai. It was in receiving the Law that Israel became a nation.

Our Christian Pentecost which we celebrate this weekend, is a mirror of the Jewish experience as told by Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. As Israel became a nation, through the experience of the Law, we became the Church through the reception of the Holy Spirit.

Luke uses several symbols in our Pentecost story. The symbol of the torah, is a tongue of fire, a flame. It is the image of the burning bush on Mount Sinai where God spoke to Moses. Luke follows this symbol with the image of tongues of fire as representing the Holy Spirit descending upon the Disciples in the place where they were hiding from the authorities.

Luke uses another symbol in his description of the Holy Spirit. He teaches us of the sound of a strong wind outside the place where the Disciples had gathered. Luke is describing the sounds as one that we hear in a drafty house when there is a strong wind outside, like a 'whistling' sound.

The wind and flame described by Luke do not take away from the image of the Law, but rather, through Jesus' coming, the Law is fulfilled. He came to achieve this and the coming of the Holy Spirit strengthened the belief. Luke teaches that life has changed through the descending of the Holy Spirit.

Luke emphasizes that the coming of the Holy Spirit is a gift which communicates the Word of God, Jesus Christ, and what He taught us about the Father. Many will believe that the 'gift of tongues' is when people thrash about or yell at the top of their voices. This is not the image which Luke is giving us. He is telling about the response of those who heard the Disciples in Jerusalem. Those who heard had received their own gift of understanding.

The Feast of the Pentecost is an opportunity for us to see that we are successors to those who first heard the Disciples tell of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is a transition from one way of seeing the world to another. All of us share in the

mission of Jesus which we receive through the Holy Spirit. To believe this, to accept this, can change us forever.


