

A Word From Our Pastor:

ast week I went over to St. Joseph's School to meet with the Grade Two students and to prepare them for their First Reconciliation.

Each of the students had their own personal folder pertaining to the sacrament. There were Scripture passages about Reconciliation. There were illustrations of how the sacrament is celebrated. A couple of the children mentioned how the drawing of the priest in the illustrations looked like me! I am much younger looking in the pictures than I am in real life.

What pleasantly surprised me was the children's response and interest in the Ten Commandments which were listed in their folders. Trying to explain the Commandments to children can be challenging but then I thought it can also be challenging trying to talk about the Commandments to adults as well.

The Ten Commandments have become the 'Ten Suggestions' to many individuals if they are thought of at all. We are reminded that the Commandments are absolute. There should be no compromise in their meaning. One might be terribly lax when it comes to keeping the Commandments and whether one likes it or not, Lent is here to remind us of this.

Going through the Commandments with the children we focused on a couple of them. The Fourth Commandment to honour Father and Mother is one in which the children would be interested. This Commandment is often emphasized to children, yet it is meant for adults well. The culture of the as Commandments was one in which not just the immediate family, but the entire extended family was the centre of everything.

The Commandments established our relationship with God and with our larger family. They tell us how a person who loves God behaves. Honouring a parent is not about how we speak to parents. Those who love God take responsibility for their parents, for all their elders. Failure to do so is a supreme failure in matching our love for God with love for our neighbour.

The Fifth Commandment can be upsetting to children. It is important to remind them that just saying words and gossiping about someone can hurt the person as well. You might say that we 'kill' the spirit of someone to the point that it makes it impossible for someone to come around anymore. You can have someone come to confession and make a proper examination of conscience with this Commandment in mind by saying, "Well Father, I know I haven't broken the Fifth commandment because I haven't killed anybody." They have just explored the surface of the commandment, not its broader meaning.

The Ten Commandments are there to allow us to be reconciled with God during this season of Lent. The Ten Commandments serve to tell us what we should see that prevents us from growing closer to God.
