

# A Word From Our Pastor:

s we pray and celebrate the Second Sunday of Lent, it is a proper time to look at the Sacrament of Baptism during this Holy Season.

Many people do not connect Baptism with the Season of Lent. They will connect Lent with the tools which are seen and used throughout the season. These tools are of course, prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Others may be focused on the Easter Triduum which celebrates the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, therefore they will see Lent as being a season of preparation.

There is nothing wrong with developing mindsets which help us with Lent by using the tools of the season. In fact, one can say that our faith revolves around one event, the Death and Resurrection of Christ Everything we think and believe about God always has to be with this event in mind. During Lent we are called to observe Jesus's act of obedience, and act of will. It is an act of or a response to love.

How does our Baptism come into play with this belief? Lent gives us an opportunity to ponder Baptism. Remembering Baptism during Lent is important because it is the first step toward entering in the experience of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, the loving obedience of Christ. You might say that we are allowed a glimpse into what God call us to become, a disciple of Christ.

In Baptism, we enter into the Death of Christ so that we can also share in His resurrection. Lent calls this experience to mind. If we desire this belief, then we can participate in the experience of Jesus' incredible act of loving obedience.

On Easter Sunday, we are asked to renew our Baptismal promises This involves saying yes to God. And professing love of Christ. We can grow in these promises by trusting in God. We can be inspired by Abraham's trust in God in our First Reading this Sunday. He did not know what God was asking of him, to leave his homeland and find a new home. Still, he listened to God and trusted in Him.

The Transfiguration story from our Gospel of today is also a story of trust and obedience. With Jesus flanked by Moses and Elijah, we are reminded to listen to them intently and respond.

Lent calls us to look at the perfect act of trust, Jesus' Death and Resurrection, it reminds us that we can share in this experience by pointing us toward our Baptism during this Season of Lent.
