

A Word From Our Pastor:

s we celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter and come closer to celebrating the Ascension of the Lord and Pentecost Sunday we also need to celebrate all mothers on the Mother's Day weekend.

With this thought in mind, I remember reading a story form a priest who had a wonderful married couple in his parish. Eventually the wife became ill and died. The husband, now a widower, was responsible for raising his children because he and his wife had several children who were still quite young. The two grandmothers stepped in and did as much as they could, but the children obviously still missed their mother. In particular, the youngest, although she barely knew her mother, still continually wished for a mother in her life.

Eventually the father fell in love and remarried. The wedding took place in the where the priest who told the story was the Pastor. At the end of the wedding ceremony, the priest gave the final blessings. However, before there was applause and the recessional hymn began, the youngest of the children asked her new stepmother in a voice all could hear: "Are you my mother now?"

On this Mother's Day we need to remind ourselves that motherhood is a very high calling and for all mothers to be true to this calling. It is important for women to realize that the love, guidance and influence they provide to their children are distinct and invaluable.

Who can mothers look towards for a true model of motherhood? Today's culture offers many models for mothers to mirror, however, often these role models are either all together wrong or they offer a very limited and unrealistic view of true motherhood.

If a mother is to be honest and true to her calling, then she needs to look at the woman who became the greatest mother of all. I am of course speaking of Mary, The Blessed Mother. Born into humble surroundings, she was called by God to be the mother of the Son of God. She truly lived out her call in both obedience and faith. One aspect of Mary's life that has meaning and inspiration for mothers today is the profound suffering which she endured during the Passion of Our Lord.
