

A Word From Our Pastor:

iturgically there is always confusion on the Solemnity of the Ascension which we celebrate this Sunday. There are some countries, like the United States, which celebrated this Solemnity on the previous Thursday which officially marks 40 days since the Resurrection of the Lord (Easter Sunday). Here in Canada, we have moved the Solemnity to today.

To have the Solemnity specifically on a Thursday has no significance. The number 40 is used to represent a considerable amount of time when knowing the exact measure of time is unimportant. 40 was also used to represent an amount of time that was enough time to accomplish a specific task, to see the task through to its completion. One needs to be reminded that St. Luke never intended to imply that Jesus remained for 40 days specifically after His Resurrection, but the Scriptures relied heavily on the symbol to make a point.

If one were to read both the Gospel of St. Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, then one would notice that they are in profound disagreement over the time between the Resurrection and the Ascension even though both were written by Luke at the same time. In the Gospel Jesus rises from the dead, appears to the Disciples, and then ascends to the Father all in the same day, however; in the Acts, there are 40 days between the Resurrection and the Ascension. Why Luke did this was basically to refocus his readers. They had strayed away from the point of both the Resurrection and the Ascension.

What Luke was attempting to illustrate was that if Jesus had remained in a physical sense, then only those who directly encountered Him would have the benefit of what He offered; but now, with His departure, He could, by the Spirit, be powerfully present through His own prophetic successors. With His departure, Jesus could send the Holy Spirit to be with the Apostles and their successors. Luke is deliberately telling two stories this weekend. In the Gospel, the story is of Jesus. In Acts, the story is of the formation of the Christian community, the Church. Both accounts of the Ascension are told to help the faith community understand the transition from the life of Christ to the life of the Church. Both stories are told to always emphasize Jesus' ongoing presence.

To be concerned about 40 days on a specific timeline is not important in our faith lives. What is important and what we should always be seeking is the message that Jesus is still with us.
