

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

s Autumn leaves signal the end of another season and the approach of Winter, the Church, on this Sunday each November, invites us to pause momentarily for serious thought. It directs our attention to the end of the world, the last judgement and the Lord's coming in glory.

Every age has its share of false prophets, scare mongering, and predicting of doom and gloom. Many fall into believing what these individuals are preaching. Just this past week, I had to deal with a person who was professing and believing in what a certain passage of the Book of Revelation was expressing. This individual and others are wrong in believing that these certain passages are predicting utter destruction. Scripture is not meant to frighten or threaten but to give consolation, hope, and encouragement in life's difficulties. The great truth of scripture is that God's love has triumphed over the power of evil and will put all things right. God is on our side and will see us through our present troubles.

Two of the readings of this week, from the Book of Daniel and from the Gospel of Mark, deal with what is called 'apocalyptic literature'. The Book of Revelation is also of this literature. This type of scripture is written for people who are asking whether staying faithful is worth the cost. Every listener is facing persecution. Every listener of these books has only one hope left, and the hope is God.

Both Daniel and Mark were written for people who were facing brutal persecution. The Jewish people were facing outright attempts to make them more like the Greeks, with the threat of destruction by foreign rulers. Still, the message was clear, though all seemed lost, God would come to their aid.

In Mark, this chapter for Sunday, is called 'The Little Apocalypse'. The early Christians were facing persecution from the Roman Empire. Once again, the message is the same: Trust in the Lord.

As we approach the end of this Liturgical Year, with the Solemnity of Christ the King next week, we are reminded that the final chapter of Jesus' love has yet to be written. Despite some proclaiming fear, we are not to fear. It is not evil that will come at the end of time, it will be Christ. Let us have the faith and hope to believe this.


