

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

s we end this liturgical year, we are reminded of the last moments of Christ's earthly life.

With his being the last Sunday that we read from the Gospel of St. Luke, we are introduced once again to one of the major themes of this gospel, namely the idea of irony. Throughout his gospel Luke could show Jesus using a reverse image in teaching about Gpd. The irony of this gospel is the sign which Pilate hung above the Cross of the Crucified Lord. With the words 'The King of the Jews', the people would have laughed at the sign and that particular notion of a condemned man being a king. What Luke is teaching us is that Jesus is truly a King like no other. He rules through service and by humble submission to His Father in Heaven. Earthly kings are not servants, they are served. Earthly kings submit to no one. Jesus pointed the World to His Father.

Luke truly stresses that the sign upon Jesus' Cross was correct. The crowd jeered at Jesus; the one criminal made fun of Him as well even as he too was being put to death. We see the innocence of Jesus hanging next to complete depravity.

Luke shows the contrast in the second criminal who, in admitting his own guilt, recognized the complete innocence of Jesus. Further, unlike the first criminal, he did not ask for Jesus to save him. He asked only to be remembered by Jesus.

Luke's love of irony allowed Jesus to challenge our assumptions about God and about our own righteousness. His whole purpose in writing was to make clear to his people and to us, who is the true King we need to recognize. We must know who Jesus is, for if we do not, we cannot possibly be true disciples.

The second criminal is actually a beautiful model of discipleship. He acknowledged his guilt and his unworthiness to approach Jesus with a request to be saved. His recognition of Jesus' innocence and the sin in his own life made it possible for Jesus to save him and to freely offer him a place in Paradise anyway.

We are reminded on this Solemnity, that Christ the King rules from the Cross, not from a palace or from an earthly piece of land. His Kingdom is not a place, but a people who give their hearts lovingly to Him by shaping their lives according to His will. This is true discipleship, and we are called to act upon it in our lives.






