

### A Word From Our Pastor:

he First Sunday of Advent is with us again, a curtain raiser, ushering in the New Year of the Church. The Season of Advent has a two-fold character. It is a preparation for celebrating Christ's birth among us and a reminder of His coming in glory at the end of time.

Advent means to be at the beginning of something. Our life with Christ has already begun. The Incarnation has already happened, and we celebrate it every Christmas. We may ask: at what, then are we at the beginning of? We need to look at last week when we celebrated the Solemnity of Christ on the last Sunday of the liturgical year. Though Christ the King is an especially important feast, it does not have its own season but in some sense, Advent fills this role. We may even call it Christ the King Season.

Advent is a time of spiritual preparation for the celebration of Christmas, but it is not just this. Advent also serves to remind us that we are waiting for Christ to come again. Preparing for Christmas during Advent should teach us to prepare for the second coming.

The Feast of Christ the King is the celebration that anticipates Christ coming again. Yes, we celebrated this just last week, still this should help shape our Advent. As we begin a new liturgical year on this First Sunday of Advent, having celebrated Christ the King just last week reminds us that we are beginning the circle once more. Yes, we celebrate Advent this Sunday, it also points us to the next Feast of Christ the King, and more, it helps us to look at the real event of Christ's coming in glory.

Obviously with Christmas approaching, we easily identify it with giving. People give gifts and many are more charitable at this time of the year. We need to see it as more than just giving. We need to show a sense of gratitude as well. God so loves us that He sent us a Saviour. We are called to imitate God in the fact that God gives, so we also give.

As we put up our Christmas decorations, we can hopefully express the belief that God promises us the joy of the Season. It is through His Son that this promise can be achieved.


