

#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ven though we have already celebrated the Feast of the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on November 2, it is still an important feast to ponder at this time in the month of November. On November 1st, All Saints Day, we are called to ponder Heaven. On the next day, we are invited by God to ponder Purgatory.

Purgatory is a much-maligned Catholic teaching. This is unfortunate because purgatory is about promise and hope, and God's unbelievable mercy. What we must remember is that Purgatory teaches us that we are responsible for our sins, 'for our thoughts, words, and deeds'. In an age of avoiding accountability, we are reminded that with God we do not escape accountability.

However, Purgatory also reminds us of God's love and mercy and His desire that we should one day live in the Kingdom. We may look upon Purgatory in terms of the verb 'to purge'. Purging us of all our sinfulness is God's final act of love in our lives. Jesus won salvation for us, but to be saved does not excuse us from our personal sin. Fortunately for us, Purgatory is the one last act of God, which makes it possible for us to enjoy this salvation won by Christ.

On this day as well, the Church calls us to pray for the dead, those marked with the sign of faith. We pray that God will see that we love them and that we want them to enjoy all the promises of salvation. We do not pray so much that a person 'gets out' of Purgatory, as in the game of "Monopoly", but rather, that God will in fact purge all those who have gone before us so that they may live with Him.

We must use this feast day to commend all the dead to God. We pray as in the commendation of the dying, that the Saints will meet our friends in Heaven, that Christ will acknowledge them and that they will be allowed to see God face to face. We pray that God will exercise His final act of mercy in order that they may live in in Heaven this day.




