### A Word From Our Pastor:

few weeks ago, we wrote about the Gospel of St. Matthew as we celebrated his feast day. This upcoming week we celebrate the feast day of another one of the Evangelists, St, Luke (October 18).

We know little about St. Luke. We do know that he was a Greek speaking convert to the Church who wrote for a non-Jewish audience. Luke was also seen as being a physician. This term was used broadly in his times, as it identified an individual as being well educated and not necessarily of possessing medical skill. St. Luke was certainly well educated. If we could speak of Luke in a few words, it is probably best to reflect on a couple of very timely emphases in his Gospel.

For instance, Luke stressed the concerns which Jesus had for members of society who were neglected or overlooked, such as women, sinners, and outcasts. We could add another group to this concern, the poor. The association of Jesus with these groups of society, was certainly radical in the context of His time and environment. Luke emphasized Jesus' constant warnings about the dangers of wealth and its pursuit. The lessons and teachings about these concerns of Jesus can be found in some famous passages of this Gospel. They include the stories of the shepherds coming to adore the newborn Christ, the parable of the Good Samaritan, the parable of the Prodigal Son, and the story of Lazarus and the Rich Man.

Another characteristic of Luke's Gospel is a strong emphasis on prayer. Throughout his Gospel, Luke shows Jesus as being apart from His Disciples and going off to pray before important and difficult moments. It is in Luke's Gospel that we find most of the words to the Hail Mary. Luke illustrates for us that, if the Son of God felt so frequently the need to pray to His Father, then we have even more reason to make the effort to pray continuously in our daily lives.

Let us always be mindful of the words of St. Luke. May they continue to be a source of strength and comfort.
