

# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

or the second week in a row, from the Gospel of Mark, we have Jesus asking "what do you want me to do for you?" The first time it was in response to James' and John's request to sit at His right and left in the Kingdom of God. It was a request made with a misunderstanding tone to it. This is not what God has to give. This week in our Gospel Jesus asks the same question of a blind man. Bartimaeus' request for healing was a most appropriate request of God, but we must understand the real question.

Blindness, which was unfortunately rather common at the time, was used as an allegory for someone without faith. The real request of the blind man was for something more than physical vision. It was a request for faith. Jesus has been desperate to teach that this was His purpose, to bring us to faith in the Father, to reconcile us to God.

Bartimaeus got what he asked for. He received his sight, but he got much more. He had faith in Jesus and despite attempts to get him to be quiet, attempts that were probably even physical ones, he persisted in his determination to reach the ear of Jesus. His persistence and his faith paid off. The response from Jesus was overwhelming. The man received the most precious gift of all, the gift of faith.

What would we have Jesus do for us? We need many things and not all of them are frivolous in nature. Much of what we want can make our lives and the lives of our families better. In Bartimaeus we see ourselves as we should become. We must make our own journey of faith. We must move away from all that possesses us, that holds us back from freely and fully attaching ourselves to Jesus Christ.

Bartimaeus knew what God had to give. The Lord had forgiveness to offer. He had true pity to give. Bartimaeus, a man with a passion to be with Jesus, had the best wish of all. He simply wished for God's love.
