

A Word From Our Pastor:

nce again Jesus uses the image of the vineyard to teach about the Kingdom of God. We are reminded that God's ways are not our ways. The vineyard owner, who represents God, goes beyond what any other owner would do. No owner would personally plant a vineyard, put a hedge around it to protect it from animals, dig a winepress, and build a tower so that guards could watch for thieves. Usually a landlord would say, "Here is the land, put on it what you need to. I will be back to collect the rent later." This landlord was quite different. provided everything. All the tenants had to do was to care for the vines and then collect the harvest.

The problem was that the tenants were ungrateful for all that the landowner had done for them. They were starting to act like God. The challenge for us is to ask ourselves: "Are we grateful to God? Do we recognize all that He has given us, beginning with our very lives? Have we noticed any blessing in our lives?" We may not react as the tenants did in a violent way, but our reaction may be one of apathy instead of anger. Which is worse? The truth is that we may reject Him in so many ways.

This parable challenges us to keep working in God's service and not become complacent. Christ is concerned that we respond to His appeal to bear fruit and become an immense and beautiful harvest.
