

# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

his upcoming week, on Thursday September 14<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. On this Feast Day we are asked to look to the Cross as a guide for our lives.

One of the verses from the Gospel of John on the Feast's Day Mass is the famous line of John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life."

This passage reminds us that God has intervened into our lives. Our business is God's business. Why? God loves us and He does not want to lose any one of us. This is what sacrificial love is. This is what we are called to practice. A sacrificial love that makes us realize that we must see that the lives of others are more important than our own.

The belief in sacrificial love is very prevalent in the reading for this Sunday. Ezekiel states in the First Reading that he was appointed "watchman for the House of Israel; you shall warn them for Me. I will hold you responsible."

These words should make us ponder how we are to respond to them. When we think of a watchman, we think of someone who protects property after everyone has gone home. Watchmen in the days of Ezekiel were not concerned about property, for many didn't own anything, but they were charged to protect people themselves. Since it was the watchman's responsibility to protect lives, Ezekiel being made the watchman for the House of Israel, implies that everyone, through Baptism has accepted this responsibility as well.

St. Paul, in our Second Reading from the Romans echoes this belief. Paul states that we are never to owe anything to anyone. This means we pay our debts and do so promptly. There is one thing, however, that we will always own other people, and that is love. This love is not how we feel about other people. In fact, there are some people for whom we have no feelings either good or bad. Paul is speaking about a special kind of love, which is call "agape". This type of love is not a feeling, but rather is an attitude that not only wishes well for another but is willing to do something to help the other.

These readings remind us that we make a commitment to agape at Baptism and we are

reminded of this commitment when we renew our Baptismal promises. We must respect not only our own commitment to live Christ's sacrificial love, but also to remind others to do the same. We are to be watchmen and to make sure we watch over and care for one another.
