

A Word From Our Pastor:

He Gospel of St. Luke is sometimes referred to as the Gospel of Social Justice because of Luke's intense concern for the poor and his references to money and the use of possessions. Today's passage is a strange one because it seems to condone dishonesty with money in the pursuit of personal comfort.

One may have heard stories where people have given large amounts of money which was earned in illegal ways or means but were given to worthy causes or with good intentions. There is a famous story in our diocese where a large amount of money was donated to the building of a church. The story was told that the money was earned not in the most proper ways. It was also said that the donor wanted to turn their life around and hence the large donation. Whether the donation was truly accepted has never been verified but it does lead to moral questions being asked, if the money had been accepted was it proper?

Today's parable, which is a little awkward since it seems to approve of dishonesty, is primarily about the mismanagement of wealth. The steward in the Gospel was entrusted to watch over the rest of the household and his master's property. The steward was in crisis because either he was dishonest or incompetent with money which was leading him to be fired from his position.

The moral lesson of the situation is not the concern of Jesus as He tells the story to the people. His concern is about the man's ability to respond to the crisis. Jesus compliments the steward by how he is able to go about to the debtors to lower their debts so that he would have a future somewhere else. Jesus basically tells His audience that the steward's actions are of a noble cause. Being dishonest was not noble, but the ability to use possessions for the sake of your future was according to Jesus.

What we need to be aware of in the Gospel is that Jesus was praising the steward for his ability to be crafty, not his actual actions which were dishonest. The complaint of Jesus was that He saw people using such craftiness for their own gain and not for the good of the Kingdom of God. This, according to Jesus' teaching, is sinful.

Considering this passage, we must ask ourselves, "Do I work harder for myself or for God?" "Have I made the connection between how I pray at Mass and what I do during the week?" "Do I use the talents which God has given me for my own good or do I use them to help my church, that is, my God?' We must always use our 'wealth' to build up the Kingdom of God.


