

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

Ith the restrictions which we have been dealing with these last 18 months, many have not be attending Mass on Sundays. At this moment in the Diocese of Hamilton, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended by Bishop Crosby for the time being. Many did not realize that there was previously an obligation to attend Sunday Mass on a regular basis. There are many who feel that this is 'old-fashioned' or is not proper anymore.

If people would take the opportunity to read the Gospel of this Sunday, they would discover two concerns that are important. The first concern is about membership in the Body of Christ, the Church. The second concern addresses the quality of membership required to be a member in good standing.

We tend to separate our relationship with God from our relationship with His Church. Many will say that they do not need to be a member of a church to have a good relationship with God. However, those who might think or say these things are at odds with the teaching of Jesus Christ.

While many will separate their relationship with God from their relationship with the Church, Jesus saw the two as being synonymous. For Jesus, being a member of the community of faith and its seriousness of membership cannot be separated from one's relationship with God. Jesus was being serious when He said "Wherever two or three are gathered, that is where I am." He taught that being absent from the community in prayer was to be absent from God.

Many would attempt to 'twist' the words of Christ to appease their own agendas and beliefs, but this is wrong. Jesus is serious about how we are called to live our faith lives, and how we are to follow Him so we may enter the Kingdom of God.

Many will say that this is punishment, but it is not. It is about loss, about what we will lose if we do not take our membership in the Body of Christ more seriously than anything else.

On December 8 2020, Pope Francis declared a **"Year of St. Joseph"** marking the 150th Anniversary of the Proclamation of Saint Joseph as the Patron Saint of the Universal Church. This year continues until December 8, 2021, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Although we read little about St. Joseph in the Bible, we know that he holds a central role in both the life of Jesus and in salvation history. In **Patris Corde: With a Father's Heart,** Pope Francis writes, "After Mary, the Mother of God, no saint is mentioned more frequently in the papal magisterium than Joseph, her spouse." He is the Patron Saint of many – workers, fathers, travelers, unborn children, immigrants, dying a happy death and is the Patron Saint of Canada. His quiet strength and obedience serves as a model of faith for all.

St. Joseph was a carpenter by trade, which allowed him to support Mary and Jesus. His actions show us of his deep faith and trust in God's plan, from accepting Mary's pregnancy to becoming a refugee in Egypt to protect Jesus; he entered fully into the plan of salvation. In **Patris Corde: With a Father's Heart**, Pope Francis highlights seven characteristics of St. Joseph, each meant to inspire us to live our own faith more deeply by emulating his qualities.

Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as a beloved, tender, and loving, obedient, accepting, creatively courageous, working father and ultimately a father in the shadows. All the characteristics show us how Joseph loved Jesus - with a father's heart. By his loving devotion, he is both a model for Christian living and a visible sign of how God loves each of us.

Pope Francis writes that, "The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal." We encourage you to read the letter and discover anew the great attributes of St. Joseph, Patron Saint of the Universal Church.
