

A Word From Our Pastor:

s we come to Labour Day weekend which marks the end of the summer season and the beginning of a new school year, it would be easy to have a theme along these lines. However, I though it would be proper to honour a saint whose Feast Day is celebrated on this Labour Day of September 5th, Saint Teresa of Calcutta or as many of us know her, Mother Teresa.

I write about her on this weekend because it is 25 years since her death which was on September 5th hence her feast day is celebrated on this day. She is a saint who many of us have seen on TV or read about throughout our lives. The first time I even learned about Saint Teresa was in 1973 when our teachers showed the film: "Something Beautiful for God" which was directed and narrated by Malcom Muggeridge. The experience of making the film left such an impression on Muggeridge that he became a Catholic a number of years later.

Pope John Paul II in his homily on the Beatification of Mother Teresa in 2003 said, "The cry of Jesus on the Cross, 'I thirst' expressing the depth of God's longing for man, penetrated Mother Teresa's soul and found fertile soil in her heart. Satiating Jesus' thirst for love and for souls had become the sole aim of Mother Teresa's existence and the inner force that drew her out of herself and made her 'run in haste' across the globe to labour for the salvation and the sanctification of the poorest of the poor."

These beautiful words from the Holy Father truly remind us of the call of discipleship which we hear in the Gospel this Sunday. Mother Teresa is a beautiful example of the words of Jesus. They are demanding words but through the life of Mother Teresa all things are possible through the gift of grace.

The demands of discipleship are that we let nothing stand between us and our ability to follow Christ. Mother Teresa left everything for the sake of Christ, her life became one of carrying the Cross. What she chose to do was not easy. It cost her dearly, but in her suffering, she was able to identify more with Christ. Her 'thirst' for Christ made it possible for her to follow Christ despite the cost.

This is our example. While we don't literally hate our families and friends or give everything we

own away, we must change our perspective toward them. This is the challenge we are called to face.


