THE FIRST SUNDAY of ADVENT



From the Desk of Father Boniface: The word Advent is from an old Latin term "to come" or "the coming". It was used in the Roman empire to announce the arrival of an

important person. And so it makes perfect

sense that the Church announces the coming of Our Lord and God Jesus Christ, Lord of Lords and King of Kings, Prince of Peace, Mighty Counselor, Emmanuel -"God with us". As John the Baptist perfectly did those two millennia ago, we too today hear the words " Hark the Advent of Our Lord is near" we see this Advent coming more and more as Christmas comes nearer and nearer. Our hearts and minds more easily turn to a spirit of peace, joy and charity. This spirit that we so often call the "Christmas Spirit" is really the presence of Jesus coming closer to us: Coming in a special and intimate way to spend His birthday with us, His beloved brothers and sisters. In fact through out our lives, these feelings of peace, joy, charity and truth is what lets us know what is authentically of the Lord and what characterizes an authentic spiritual life. And so, as Christ comes closer and closer we prepare to celebrate His birth, we decorate our homes, we buy gifts for our loved ones and reach out in charity to those who perhaps may not have people to celebrate with. We acclaim the joy of the Lord as we smile and say "Merry Christmas" to all. But we should also prepare the inside of us as well, for it is in our hearts that Jesus comes to dwell and so we ask ourselves, is there something that is preventing me from experiencing all the good gifts of joy, peace and charity that the Lord wants to give me. It may seem that we may have to pray for the person who wronged us, or stretch out our hand in peace to those who angered us. It may also mean that we examine our conscience and make a good confession. Like many, we to offer our fiat "I am the handmaiden of the Lord, let it be done to me accordingly to your word". (Luke 1:38) Before Christmas so that nothing holds us back from these gifts the Lord brings for us. This is why Advent is a penitential season and why we wear purple, as St. John the Baptist said, "prepare the way of the Lord and make His paths straight" (Luke 3:4). Sometimes it is a lot of work to prepare our homes but when the honoured guests come our joy is made even more. The same is definitely true for Christ. For when our heart is open to receive Him, our joy is made complete.
