

Desk Scribbles ... Fifth Sunday of Lent .. April 10, 2011 ... Jim Link, C.R.

Many years ago when I was chaplain at the university in Waterloo, Melinda, my colleague in chaplaincy, and I were called over to visit the home of a dying friend named Joan. We went there to celebrate the last rites with her to help her prepare for death. After praying and giving her holy communion, she looked up at us from her bed and said, "This is so hard!" "What's hard?" we asked her. "Dying," Joan replied, "I've never done this before."

In the gospel today we hear of the raising of Lazarus. This was not the first person that Jesus brought back from the dead but it certainly was one of the most dramatic miracles he had worked. I have met people who died, medically speaking, and had come back to life. For many of them, their second chance was a new beginning for them. They lived their lives with a renewed sense of purpose and focus in a way that was certainly less selfish than before their death. Their death sort of realigned their sense of life priorities and many things that they had considered so important were reassessed as less. And from my experience dealing with death over 35 years as a priest, I have learned that at the end of our lives if we don't have faith, family and friends, we die poor.

When I reflect on it, it is true what my friend Joan said that she was having a hard time dying since she had not done it before. But the truth is, all our lives are a rehearsal for the death that will ultimately close our eyes forever this world. Our lives then are a proving ground and a testing zone for our faith. When that time comes, will we believe that it is not really the end but a new beginning and a passage to a new and different life? Scripture writer, Patricia Sanchéz (*Celebration*, National Catholic Reporter Pub., Kansas City, MO: April 2011) captures well what I too believe:

"During the life span of any human being, there is, of course, one conclusive and ultimate death. Everybody dies. But there are also many little and large experiences of dying along the way. There are the losses of friends and family whose absences create dying in our hearts. There are the losses of oppressed and needy brothers and sisters throughout the world whose deaths continue to assault the consciences of those more fortunate. There is the dying of a friendship as it is surrendered to an argument that cannot or will not be resolved. There are the deaths come as the distances between us grow larger and our times of communion less frequent. There are the inevitable deaths when memory fails, when bones break and muscles ache with the loss of youthful vigor. There are also deaths that come with the loss of a job or a home. In all these experiences of death., believer are assured that these deaths are but a prelude to that final act of surrender to God Each helps us prepare for the moment that is not an end but a passage to a new and endless beginning. In that final moment, and in all the little preludes of dying that lead up to that moment, Jesus will say to us as he said so long ago at the tomb of Lazarus, "Come out! Unbind him and let him go free!"
