Permanent Diaconate Information Meeting

At the present time there are 35 deacons serving in the Diocese of Hamilton, and nine men are currently in formation.

Essentially a ministry of service and charity, the deacon serves the Church and the diocese in a designated service in a hospital, or prison, or other forms of charitable outreach. In addition, the deacon is assigned to a parish, as his liturgical base, where he assists the pastor, as needed, in liturgical ministry which may take the form of assisting at mass, preaching, baptizing, presiding at weddings or funerals, or in other capacities within the parish.

Deacons may be married, and spouses of deacons are invited and strongly encouraged to be involved in the vocation and ministry of their deacon-husband.

Diaconate formation lasts for four years. The next formation session begins in September 2014, and applications for admission into the formation program are being accepted at this time.

1 Kings 17:17-24; Ps 30; Gal 1:11-19; Luke 7:11-17

It was many years ago that I was with my priest friend Chris and we were visiting the Resurrectionists in Louisville, Kentucky. One afternoon we decided to head out for a bit of a break and get a hamburger. We turned the corner heading for the restaurant and there he was, a man who was standing in the middle of the road, somewhat unsteady and bloodied. At first we thought he had fallen from the overpass; then we figured he has fallen and hurt himself because he was over served at the bar. Regardless, I must admit that my first feeling was not that we weren't going to stop and help him but a bit of anger because of the inconvenience. Three hospitals later, we finally got someone who was willing to take a look at him and check him out for serious injuries. He was going to survive to live another day.

The readings this weekend present us with two widows who have lost their sons. With no husband, no inheritance rights and no voice, both were dependent on their sons as their legal protectors. Elijah and Jesus gave back to these two women not only their sons but their own lives in society. The Sidonian woman in the first reading accused Elijah of rubbing her sins in her face since according to the thinking of the times, the bad or good

things that happened to you in your life were a direct punishment for the bad or good things we had done. Elijah did not pay attention to her theology but acted from his heart. Jesus did the same in the gospel story of the widow from Nain. For him to touch the corpse of her son would make him unclean and unworthy to enter or pray at the synagogue. He did not care; he healed him anyway.

And that is what happens when God visits; things happen and nothing remains the same. God meets us and takes us where we are at. In a book that changed my life by Jesuit author Peter van Breemen called As Bread That is Broken, he wrote in the first chapter that we need to pray for the courage to accept acceptance. Why? Because God loves and accepts us exactly as we are, not as we should be or could be or will be but exactly where we sit and stand right now. This is too good to be true but it's true. For me at the time, I know I had a difficult time accepting this not only because it goes against our entire life training and expectations, that is, we earn and merit everything we do and thus we deserve our blessings. This is not so with God and therein lies the problem because it cuts straight to the heart of pride. In the face of such unconditional love, we have no control over it: it just keeps on coming after us. The only thing we can do is reject it.

God comes to visit you and me constantly. Let us be open to welcoming this loving and accepting presence of God in our lives and pray that we are humble and courageous enough to accept God's acceptance. It will truly set us free and being free we will be set free to love others as God loves because we are securely grounded in love. Then nobody in need will ever be an inconvenience but just another blessed opportunity.
