

Wis 7:7-11; Ps 90; Heb 4:12-13; Mark 10:17-30

It's Wednesday noon and I am in pain. My gout started a major flare-up last Friday on my way to Montreal (for a funeral of a friend of mine). By Sunday, on the drive back I could only manage driving with my left hand. My right hand is swollen and so is my left foot. This all started back in August by an over prescription of a drug I was taking for high blood pressure. Who would have thought a tiny pill could cause such an imbalance in my blood? So, if you see me hobbling around and not moving too well, there is a reason.

I am trying my best to learn from this experience and not waste it but, as any of you who have lived with pain know, that is easier said than done. Friends of mine have reminded me to offer up my pain for those in purgatory; I am trying and I hope that it helps someone move on to God. I am trying to let the pain and limitations of movement teach me patience and humility; the lessons of humility and patience are lifelong classes I have been taking since childhood. Most of all, I think, I am just praying more, asking God for healing.

The gospel story of Jesus and his dialogue with the rich young man was a flashback for me. I was on retreat in Middleton, Connecticut and the director had given us to meditate and pray on this very passage. The message behind the story seemed pretty obvious, that is, the young man had been doing all the right things but, at the end of the day, his trust was still in what he possessed. Last week we celebrated the feast of St. Francis of Assisi who was very much like the rich young man in the gospel but who actually did leave it all behind to follow Jesus.

On another retreat years ago, I met Fr. David Knight, a former Jesuit who had left his community to found a new religious community that was trying to live out the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience in a more radical way. I remember him telling us that as Resurrectionists, we could talk as much as we wanted about the vow of poverty and trying to live a simple life but, he said, the truth is, you will never know until you actually become poor and let it all go. In some ways, I guess, it's the difference between being an observer and a participant.

For me, in my encounter with Jesus in the gospel, as Jesus looked at me and loved me, I realized that my greatest possession was not embodied in any material stuff I had but it was me, myself and I. Jesus wanted me! He did not want my stuff. In my religious community most of us realize that as we get older, poverty and chastity are not the main challenges, but obedience. We make a vow to let our wills, our power to direct our lives, be subject to the will of God as manifested through the spirit and leadership of our religious community.

All this brings me back to today as I struggle in being obedient to the limitations of being sick. I need to trust that there is a reason and that some good will come out of it even if I don't know what that is right now. And the gospel story is not really about the rich young man but about you and me. Will we go away sad because we cannot relinquish our many possessions --- or will we allow Jesus' look of love to light our way and keep us close to him?
