

ASK THE DEACON GUY

Question: What is the correct "Sign of Peace"?

Answer: In the diocese of Canada, the sign of peace is given by a handshake or bow, offer to those who are nearest, in a gentle & calm manner. One practice that has made its way into the Rite of Peace is the victory sign 'V', done with the raising of two fingers, this sign does not convey the proper disposition of the 'Peace of Christ'.

CONTACT TRACING FORM

When arriving at church, everyone needs to sign the Contact Tracing Form and include their phone number. The Contact Tracing form is strictly used **only** if the EOHU contacts us. This form will be shredded after two months as per the directive from the Diocese.

ATTENDANCE RESTRICTIONS ELEVATED

Restrictions have been lifted enough that we are back to having thirty percent (30%) capacity in the church for masses. This change came into effect starting on Tuesday, February 16, 2021 and remains in effect even when we enter the RED restrictions.

When leaving the church, you must leave the kneeler in the down position for the volunteers who are sanitizing the pews.

VOLUNTEERS

In order for St. Columban's to remain open during this Pandemic we need volunteers to sanitize pews after every mass or service held in the church. This does not take long and gloves are provided. Will you be the hands of Christ?

IN OUR PARISH AND DIOCESE

PATRONS OF ST. COLUMBAN FOUNDATION FUNDRAISER

The top priority for the Patrons of Columban Foundation and the Parish Finance Council at this time is to raise the funds necessary to restore the church steeple and put a new cross back up on the church in the <u>LIFT UP THE CROSS</u> project. The latest cost estimate for this project is \$130,000. All funds raised by the Foundation this year will be allocated to <u>LIFT UP THE</u> <u>CROSS</u> project.

The Foundation is also contacting potential major donors, individuals, businesses, organizations and those who wish to donate in memory of a family member to donate at the following levels-\$1,000, \$2,500, \$5,000, 10,000, \$25,000. Major donors will be recognized in the parish bulletin and on a donor wall plaque in the church. Donors can also donate on a weekly or monthly basis to reach their total donation.

At all the masses on the May 8-9 weekend, a special collection will be taken for the Patrons of St. Columban Foundation. Parishioners with church envelopes can use the special May 9 envelope in their box of envelopes. If you do not have a box of envelopes, you may use the blue envelope found at the church entrances. Cheques should be made payable to the Patrons of St. Columban Foundation. Income tax receipts will be issued by the Foundation.

With the new lockdown if you are not able to attend mass, you can still donate to the Foundation by mailing your May 9 Foundation envelope and donation to Patrons of St. Columban Foundation at 36 4th St., West, Cornwall, ON. K6J 2R6 or by dropping off your Foundation envelope in the parish office mailbox at 36 4th St. West. If you do not have a Foundation envelope, indicate on your own envelope <u>Foundation Donation</u> and mail or drop off your donation at the parish office.

EASTER IS A SEASON!

Many people mistakenly believe that Easter is one day only. In fact, the Easter season goes on for 50 days, ending on Pentecost! The Church spends 50 days celebrating the great news of Christ's resurrection. During this time, we read stories of Jesus visiting with the apostles, the same apostles who thought that His death on the Cross had been the end. Both the Ascension, when Jesus is taken up into Heaven, and Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit comes down upon to the apostles, are important parts of this Easter season.

THE DIVINE MERCY MESSAGE AND DEVOTION

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- A Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- B Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- C Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

The message and devotional practices proposed in the Diary of Saint Faustina and set forth in this web site and other publications of the Marians of the Immaculate Conception are completely in accordance with the teachings of Church and are firmly rooted in the Gospel message of our Merciful Savior. Properly understood and implemented, they will help us grow as genuine followers of Christ. Spend time to learn more about the mercy of God, learn to trust in Jesus, and live your life as merciful to others, as Christ is merciful to you.
