

EASTER IS A SEASON!

Many people mistakenly believe that Easter is one day only. In fact, the Easter season goes on for 50 days, ending on Pentecost! The Church spends 50 days celebrating the great news of Christ's resurrection. During this time, we read stories of Jesus visiting with the apostles, the same apostles who thought that His death on the Cross had been the end. Both the Ascension, when Jesus is taken up into Heaven, and Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit comes down upon the apostles, are important parts of this Easter season.

IN OUR PARISH AND DIOCESE

PATRONS OF ST. COLUMBAN FOUNDATION FUNDRAISER

The top priority for the Patrons of Columban Foundation and the Parish Finance Council at this time is to raise the funds necessary to restore the church steeple and put a new cross back up on the church in the <u>LIFT UP THE CROSS</u> project. MASS ATTENDANCE DURING STAY-AT-HOME ORDER – STARTING APRIL 8, 2021

The Provincial Government has issued a stay-at-home order with exceptions for essential purposes. It will last 28 days. Parishioners are encouraged to adhere to this directive to remain home with exceptions for essential purposes.

Religious services that include Mass continue to be limited to 15% of capacity, which means 90 people at each Mass, including the Priest, Deacon, and volunteers.

Health officials have expressed concern regarding the faithful congregating in or around the church before and after services. Please do not congregate at the doors of the church or in the parking lot. We asked you to go directly to your car without visiting with your fellow parishioners.

Please wear your face covering to cover the nose, mouth and chin and maintain a 6ft distance when entering or exiting the church. Sanitize your hands and sign the contact tracing sheet and go directly to a pew marked with the green tape and once seated, do not change pews. When exiting, leave the kneeler in the down position, maintain the 6ft rule and go directly to your cars.

The parish office is closed to the public and working on a curb-side model of service.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint George - April 23, 2021

Saint George, also George of Lydda, was a Christian who is accepted as a saint in Christianity. According to traditional rumors, he was a soldier in the Roman army. His parents were Christians of Greek origin. His father, Gerontius, was a Cappadocian serving in the Roman army. His mother, Polychronia, was a Christian from the city of Lod in Palestine. Saint George was a soldier of Cappadocian Greek origins, member of the Praetorian Guard for Roman emperor Diocletian, who was sentenced to death for refusing to recant his Christian faith. He became one of the most venerated saints and megalomartyrs in Christianity, and he has been especially venerated as a military saint since the Crusades.

Hagiography constituted an important literary genre in the early Christian church, providing some informational history along with the more inspirational stories and legends. In hagiography, as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers and one of the most prominent military saints, Saint George is immortalized in the legend of Saint George and the Dragon. His memorial, Saint George's Day, is traditionally celebrated on 23 April. England, Ethiopia, Georgia, Catalonia and Aragon in Spain, Moscow in Russia, and several other states, regions, cities, universities, professions and organizations claim George as their patron.

Saint George was martyred on 23, April 303, and his bones are buried in his tomb (sarcophagus) in the Church of Saint George, Lod, Israel. (Wikipedia)
