The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops & The Evangelical Fellowship of Canada – Declaration on Euthanasia & Assisted Suicide

Assisted suicide and euthanasia raise profound social, moral, legal, theological and philosophical questions - questions that go to the very core of our understanding of who we are, the meaning of life, and the duty of care we owe to each other. The recent Supreme Court of Canada decision has brought this issue to the forefront of public discussion and compels each of us as Canadians to reflect upon our personal and societal response to those who need our compassion and care.

We, the undersigned, each from the basis of our sacred teachings and enduring traditions, affirm the sanctity of all human life, and the equal and inviolable dignity of every human being. This is an affirmation shared by societies and cultures around the world and throughout history. Human dignity is not exclusively a religious belief, although for us it has a significant religious meaning. Furthermore, we affirm that reverence for human life is the basis and reason for our compassion, responsibility and commitment in caring for all humans, our brothers and sisters, when they are suffering and in pain.

The sanctity of human life is a foundational principle of Canadian society. It has both individual and communal import: it undergirds the recognition of the equal dignity of each individual regardless of their abilities or disabilities and shapes and guides our common life together, including our legal, health care and social welfare systems. It engenders the collective promotion of life and the protection of the vulnerable.

While Canadian society continues to affirm the importance of human dignity, there is a worrisome tendency to define this subjectively and emotionally. For us, human dignity is most properly understood as the value of a person's life before her or his Creator and within a social network of familial and societal relationships. We are convinced the only ways to help people live and die with dignity are: to ensure they are supported by love and care; to provide holistic care which includes pain control as well as psychological, spiritual and emotional support; and, to improve and increase resources in support of palliative and home care.

On the basis of our respective traditions and beliefs, we insist that any action intended to end human life is morally and ethically wrong. Together, we are determined to work to alleviate human suffering in every form but never by intentionally eliminating those who suffer.

ARCHBISHOP PRENDERGAST APPOINTED APOSTOLIC ADMINISTRATOR OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF ALEXANDRIA-CORNWALL

Pope Francis has named Archbishop Terrence Prendergast, S.J., Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Ottawa, the Apostolic Administrator of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Alexandria-Cornwall. As Apostolic Administrator, he takes over the temporary governance of the Diocese.

"It's an honour to serve the clergy, religious and faithful of another local church, respecting the unique characteristics of that church," said Archbishop Prendergast about his appointment. "The coming months will be a time of challenge," he added, "as together we reflect on the needs of Alexandria-Cornwall, its pastoral plan for evangelization and renewal and how the future might unfold. I thank the Holy Father for the privilege of serving in this way. I ask all in Ottawa and Alexandria-Cornwall to pray for me—to pray for us—in the days ahead".

Archbishop Prendergast made a visit to Cornwall a day after being named Apostolic Administrator, (meeting with the diocesan College of Consultors) and dealt head on with a big question. What will the future be for the local Catholic diocese? "Should a new Bishop be named?" Prendergast asked. "Should the (Alexandria-Cornwall diocese) be associated with another diocese?"

The answers will come over the next 18 months. "There are (several issues), there are smaller numbers in (Cornwall-Alexandria)," Prendergast said. "Can we afford it? How far can the diocese be diminished before other steps have to be taken? "(Another issue is) finding a priest who's bilingual, because the diocese is bilingual." Prendergast said he'll be "listening to the people, listening to the priests," during his time here. "It's an 18-month process." At the end of it, after all the consultations, Prendergast will make his recommendation to the pope. Prendergast is in his 9th year as Archbishop of Ottawa; before that he was Archbishop for Halifax and apostolic administrator for neighbouring Yarmouth.

He will be back at the Alexandria-Cornwall Diocese in two weeks. At the College of Consultors meeting, Prendergast confirmed that Fr. Kelvin Maloney (pastor of St. Finnan's Cathedral) will stay on as Vicar General, or second in command at the local diocese. He also noted that the Auxiliary Bishop in Ottawa could also be involved in matters with the Alexandria-Cornwall diocese.

"We had a very good meeting" Prendergast said. "The fact that we talked about 18 months (for a major decision) was encouraging to (local priests). The Vatican hasn't decided one way or another (what will happen to Alexandria-Cornwall)." Prendergast acknowledged what priests told him: that there would be a sense of loss, if, after having a bishop for 125 years, there was none close by in this community.

For now, Prendergast plans to enjoy meeting new people. "I've gotten to see very different-size dioceses," he said. "Every one has its own character, it's own charm, it's own history... for me what's important is to respect the local church, the local people."
