The Solemnity of the Epiphany has a rich tradition all around the world. By translating its name epiphania, which means "revelation", we find the rich meaning of today's feast. On this feast we celebrate the revelation of God's saving love in Jesus. The offer of God's salvation is for all people. This is made clear by the presence of the Gentiles found in all of today's readings.

The first reading from the Old Testament reflects the joy felt by the people of Jerusalem after their return

from Exile. God's light has come and God's people are delivered. God's saving act is like a beacon of light shining before the entire world, showing the compassion and love of the Lord. Even Gentiles are drawn to God's radiant light, as they stream toward Jerusalem from every corner of the earth.


In today's Gospel the wise men from the east are drawn to the Saviour by the light of a star. These magi are foreigners. They are Gentiles who have not learned about the Law or the Prophets. However, these foreigners find the Christ child and honour Him. The Gospel today shows how the journey of the magi is a journey of faith, guided by the light of God's love. The wise men follow a star, which leads them to Christ the light of salvation.

A KEY SCRIPTURAL THEME: UNIVERSAL OFFER OF SALVATION

Today's feast of the Epiphany proclaims that God's gift of salvation is for all people.

The word Epiphany means to show forth or to make visible. This feast reminds us that Jesus, the Saviour of the world, was made visible to the Magi. Jesus welcomes all those who seek Him.

The Catholic Church believes that all are meant to share in God's love. "The Church's essential nature is universal...preaching the Word of God and proclaiming the kingdom throughout the whole world" (AG 1).

Pope Francis – Christmas Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Happy Christmas!

Jesus, the Son of God, the Savior of the world, is born for us, born in Bethlehem of a Virgin, fulfilling the ancient prophecies. The Virgin's name is Mary, the wife of Joseph.

Humble people, full of hope in the goodness of God, are those who welcome Jesus & recognize Him. And so the Holy Spirit enlightened the shepherds of Bethlehem, who hastened to the grotto & adored the Child. Then the Spirit led the elderly & humble couple Simeon & Anna into the temple of Jerusalem & they recognized Jesus the Messiah. "My eyes have seen Your salvation", Simeon exclaimed, "the salvation prepared by God in the sight of all peoples" (Lk 2:30).

"Yes, brothers and sisters, Jesus is the salvation for every person & for every people! Today I ask Him, the Savior of the world, to look upon our brothers & sisters in Iraq and Syria, who for too long now have suffered the effects of ongoing conflict & who, together with those belonging to other ethnic & religious groups, are suffering a brutal persecution. May Christmas bring them hope, as indeed also to the many displaced persons, exiles & refugees, children, adults & elderly, from this region & from the whole world. May indifference be changed into closeness & rejection into hospitality, so that all who now are suffering may receive the necessary humanitarian help to overcome the rigors of winter, return to their countries and live with dignity.

May the Lord open hearts to trust, & may He bestow His peace upon the whole Middle East, beginning with the land blessed by His birth, thereby sustaining the efforts of those committed effectively to dialogue between Israelis & Palestinians.

May Jesus, Savior of the world, protect all who suffer in Ukraine, and grant that their beloved land may overcome tensions, conquer hatred and violence, and set out on a new journey of fraternity and reconciliation.

May Christ the Savior give peace to Nigeria, where (even in these hours) more blood is being shed and too many people are unjustly deprived of their possessions, held as hostages or killed. I invoke peace also on the other parts of the African continent, thinking especially of Libya, South Sudan, the Central African Republic & various regions of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. I beseech all who have political responsibility to commit themselves through dialogue to overcoming differences & to building a lasting, fraternal coexistence. May Jesus save the vast numbers of children who are victims of violence, made objects of trade and trafficking, or forced to become soldiers; children, so many abused children. May He give comfort to the families of the children killed in Pakistan last week. May He be close to all who suffer from illness, especially the victims of the Ebola epidemic, above all in Liberia, in Sierra Leone and in Guinea. As I thank all who are courageously dedicated to assisting the sick & their family members. I once more make an urgent appeal that the necessary assistance & treatment be provided.

My thoughts turn to all those children today who are killed & ill-treated, be they infants killed in the womb, deprived of that generous love of their parents & then buried in the egoism of a culture that does not love life; be they children displaced due to war and persecution, abused and taken advantage of before our very eyes and our complicit silence.

I think also of those infants massacred in bomb attacks, also those where the Son of God was born. Even today, their impotent silence cries out under the sword of so many Herods. On their blood stands the shadow of contemporary Herods. Truly there are so many tears this Christmas, together with the tears of the Infant Jesus.

Dear brothers and sisters, may the Holy Spirit today enlighten our hearts, that we may recognize in the Infant Jesus, born in Bethlehem of the Virgin Mary, the salvation given by God to each one of us, to each man and woman and to all the peoples of the earth. May the power of Christ, which brings freedom and service, be felt in so many hearts afflicted by war, persecution and slavery. May this divine power, by its meekness, take away the hardness of heart of so many men and women immersed in worldliness and indifference, the globalization of indifference. May His redeeming strength transform arms into ploughshares, destruction into creativity, hatred into love and tenderness. Then we will be able to cry out with joy: "Our eyes have seen Your salvation". With these thoughts I wish you all a Happy Christmas!
