A person of *honour*—a person who gains *honour*—is a person of honesty, uprightness, ethics, morals, principles, virtue, goodness, and integrity. Take some quiet time to think about these qualities of a person—a parent—who deserves honour. Ask God to show you where you may need to grow and change.



MASS ATTENDANCE DURING PROVINCE-WIDE REOPENING PLAN

The Provincial Government has announced that Ontario is to enter stage 1 of the reopening plan on Friday, June 11, 2021, at 12:01 a.m. Entering stage 1 will allow indoor religious services, rites and ceremonies, including weddings and funerals at 15% capacity of the room. Outdoors religious services, rites and ceremonies, including weddings and funerals, will be permitted with capacity limited to allow physical distancing of 2 metres. St. Columban's Church will implement the new restrictions starting Friday, June 11, at the 7:30 a.m. mass. Parishioners must still maintain Covid protocols with social distancing of 2 meters and wearing masks.

SAFETY PROTOCOL

Please do not congregate at the doors of the church or in the parking lot. We asked you to go directly to your car without visiting with your fellow parishioners. Wear your face covering to cover the nose, mouth and chin and maintain a 6ft distance when entering or exiting the church. Sanitize your hands and sign the contact tracing sheet and go directly to a pew marked with the green tape and once seated, do not change pews. When exiting, leave the kneeler in the down position, maintain the 6ft rule and go directly to your cars.

SAINT OF THE WEEK Saint Benedict – July 11

Benedict, Father of Western monasticism, lived circa 480 to 547. He was born in Nursia in central Italy. The little we know of his personal life comes from two documents: the second Dialogue of Gregory the Great, and the Rule written by Benedict himself.

Benedict was educated in Rome, a decadent city. After a few years, convinced that God was calling him to be a monk or hermit, Benedict fled to a local village. After a brief stay with some holy men, he decided on a life of solitude. He received the monastic habit at Subiaco, and retired to a cave, where he lived alone in the tradition of the Desert Fathers. Soon, he began to attract followers and he built 12 small monasteries.

Between 520 and 530, he and a few companions founded the great monastery of Monte Cassino, where Benedict spent the rest of his life and wrote his Rule. This work became the primary influence on Western religious life for the next 600 years and is still followed by the "daughters and sons" of Saint Benedict. This remarkable guide reflects the fatherly concern and charity of Benedict as he adapted the austere rule of the Desert Fathers to community life. He emphasized moderation, humility, obedience, prayer and manual labour as the way to holiness. Saint Benedict is considered the Patriarch of Western Monasticism, and was proclaimed a patron of Europe in 1964 by Pope Paul VI.
