

PAPAL VISIT TO CANADA

With this announcement, the Vatican confirmed the Holy Father will make three stops during his visit to Canada: Edmonton, Québec, and Igaluit.

ICON OF ST. JOSEPH

Every few years, the Knights of Columbus selects an icon of a saint whose patronage is particularly inspiring to Knights and their communities. We like to celebrate that we are free to "live the good life." We can do what we want, anytime we want, with no regard for laws. But Jesus calls us to a different kind of freedom. St. Paul reminds us that by imitating Jesus, we are freed from becoming a slave to our own self-interests and desires so that we can serve one another. We are free to share our gifts and promote God's work on earth to glorify His name and not honour ourselves.

IN OUR PARISH AND DIOCESE

LOVE THY NEIGHBOUR...

A Deacon's ministry in a Parish is a threefold mission of Service to the Word of God, the Eucharist (Liturgy), and Charity & Justice. Since arriving here at St. Columban Parish in the shadow of the pandemic restrictions, my main focus was to be of service to the Word and the Eucharist (Liturgy). As the restrictions are relaxing and life begins to move to a new normal it is important to make the necessary steps to foster Charity & Justice.

In short, a Deacon brings the poor to the Church and the Church to the Poor.

This means it is time to introduce the **Love Thy Neighbour Apostolate**, with a mission to love God by loving your neighbour through works of charity and justice.

Don't like the word Apostolate scare you it is just a fancy word for evangelistic activity or works.

As a parish, we have been doing this work already....

- more than 160 jars of Peanut Butter to the Agape Centre Drive in Fall of 2021
- over 25 bags of warm winter clothes and men's clothes donated to the Lighthouse drop-in centre
- a successful Lenten food drive that saw more than 30 boxes of food be shared with Centre 105, St. Vincent de Paul, and Agape Centre.

So, what is next... easy question, with a no so easy answer ... in the last few months we have seen that in our own community, there is an apparent insecurity of food and shelter.

Here are some of the ongoing programs that we have in place:
- Donation box on the wall to support the operation of the St.

Vincent de Paul

- Two cardboard boxes for clothing donations for Lighthouse Drop-in centre
- Shelving units that have food available for our parishioners to help with Food insecurity

There are a number of initiatives that would be wonderful to have, to help spread charity in our community. Here are some ideas ... Community Garden, Fresh Food Table, community BBQ.

To do this I am looking for a team of dedicated people to help guide, organise and promote this **Love thy Neighbour Apostolate.** Please let me know if you are interested.
