In today's Gospel, Jesus warns us that the Temple—God the Father's house—does not exist to serve as a marketplace or as a bank. It is a holy place with a holy purpose. Take a few moments to think about what happens in God's house, your parish church. Identify ways that your *domestic Church*, your "Church of the home," is a holy place—a place where God dwells.



SAINT OF THE WEEK ST. FRANCES OF ROME – March 9th

Saint Frances of Rome, Italian Santa Francesca Romana, was born in 1384 In Rome, Italy. She died on March 9, 1440, in Rome. Frances was canonized in 1608, and her feast day is March 9.

When she was only 13, Frances' parents married her to Lorenzo de' Ponziani, whose sister-in-law, Vannozza, helped Frances draft a rule of life for what would be a new order.

Saint Frances of Rome was a model wife and mother for forty years, often in violent and difficult circumstances provoked by skirmishes related to the Western Schism, the era of more than one pope which divided Rome's elites into warring factions. In addition to performing her domestic duties so faithfully, Frances also fasted, prayed, had a vibrant, mystical spirituality, and was generous with the poor. Her charity toward the needy was not the modern charity of making charitable donations. She did the work, not someone else. She made personal contact with the homeless, the hungry, and beggars. Her sterling example of piety and service led her to found a group of likeminded women who lived in the world but who bound themselves to a life of prayer and service. She founded in 1425 the Oblates of Mary. The group was later recognized as an order in the Church under the title the Oblates of Saint Frances of Rome.

Ask the Deacon guy...

Question: What should I pray or be thinking about after I receive the Eucharist?

Reply: You have just consumed the Body & Blood, the Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ; you now have the true presence of God. So it is a good idea not to be making grocery lists or thinking about the football game.

My suggestion is to pray the words that are often prayed during Eucharistic Adoration:

O Sacrament most holy,

O Sacrament divine,

All praise and all thanksgiving,

Be every moment thine.

The time after reception of the Eucharist is a time to be thankful for the gift that God has given us, his beloved Son. DG
