

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST – JUNE 6TH

The Sisters of the Precious Blood, formally of Alexandria and now residing in Dundas, Ontario, sent an invitation to join with them to express gratitude in celebration of Thanksgiving and Praise in the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus on June 6th, by joining with them in a Novena and Feast Day Masses. The Novena and Feast Day Masses begin May 28th to June 6th. This year our celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) takes on new and deep meaning in this unforgettable year of enforced isolation from the Eucharist. Before the lockdown, few Catholics had heard of or were familiar with the phrase "Spiritual Communion."

Many of us who have turned to online liturgies in the stress and isolation of the pandemic now experience spiritual Communion as a spiritual lifeline. The desire for the Eucharist kept alive through spiritual Communion deepens our longings to participate physically in the Eucharist.

Making a spiritual Communion is a stark reminder of the negative reality of physical isolation from the real, sacramental presence of Jesus' Body and Blood at every Eucharist. Yet, it also serves as a positive reminder that our desire to be nourished by God's grace is met by Jesus' desire to be sacramentally present to us.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls the Eucharist the "source and summit of the Christian life." (No. 1324) Everything in the Church's life and of each Christian finds its source and goal in the Eucharist. St. Paul explains why this is true in the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians when he says, "The cup of blessing that we bless is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." (1 Cor. 10.16-17)

At every Eucharist, we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist species of bread and wine, in the priest who acts in the person of Christ the head, in the sacred word of God proclaimed and, in the assembly, gathered to worship God in faith and thanksgiving. Today our Communion, spiritual or in-person, invites us to deep joy and amazement as we pray, "speak to me, Lord."

THE NOVENA PRAYER

"Lord Jesus Christ, we worship you living among us in the sacrament of your body and blood. May we offer to our Father in heaven a solemn pledge of undivided love. May we offer to our brothers and sisters a life poured out in loving service of that kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

SAINT OF THE WEEKSaint Philip Neri - May 26

Philip Neri was born in Florence in 1515 and educated by the Dominicans. He experienced conversion at the age of 18 and left for Rome, where he lived a life of seclusion and poverty. He studied philosophy and theology for three years before choosing to re-evangelize Rome, where Christianity had declined and was sadly in need of reform. He spent his days talking to people about God's love, and his nights in prayer.

In 1548 he helped found a confraternity of laymen to minister to needy pilgrims, leading to the establishment of a now-famous Roman hospital, Santa Trinità dei Pellegrini. In 1551, his confessor insisted Philip be ordained. As a confessor himself, he was much sought after for his spiritual wisdom. Disciples flocked to him, and he founded the congregation of the Oratorians, which was formally approved in 1575. Pope Gregory XIII gave them an ancient church in Rome, which they rebuilt and occupy to this day.

Philip's sermons were famous for their wisdom and good humour. He said, "I will have no sad spirits in my house. Cheerful people are more easily led to perfection." He died at the age of 80, much loved and respected, and is still known as the "Apostle of Rome."
