

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST – JUNE 6TH

The Sisters of the Precious Blood, formally of Alexandria and now residing in Dundas, Ontario, sent an invitation to join with them to express gratitude in celebration of Thanksgiving and Praise in the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus on June 6th, by joining with them in a Novena and Feast Day Masses. The Novena and Feast Day Masses begin May 28th to June 6th. This year our celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) takes on new and deep meaning in this unforgettable year of enforced isolation from the Eucharist. Before the lockdown, few Catholics had heard of or were familiar with the phrase "Spiritual Communion."

Many of us who have turned to online liturgies in the stress and isolation of the pandemic now experience spiritual Communion as a spiritual lifeline. The desire for the Eucharist kept alive through spiritual Communion deepens our longings to participate physically in the Eucharist.

Making a spiritual Communion is a stark reminder of the negative reality of physical isolation from the real, sacramental presence of Jesus' Body and Blood at every Eucharist. Yet, it also serves as a positive reminder that our desire to be nourished by God's grace is met by Jesus' desire to be sacramentally present to us.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls the Eucharist the "source and summit of the Christian life." (No. 1324) Everything in the Church's life and of each Christian finds its source and goal in the Eucharist. St. Paul explains why this is true in the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians when he says, "The cup of blessing that we bless is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." (1 Cor. 10.16-17)

At every Eucharist, we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist species of bread and wine, in the priest who acts in the person of Christ the head, in the sacred word of God proclaimed and, in the assembly, gathered to worship God in faith and thanksgiving. Today our Communion, spiritual or in-person, invites us to deep joy and amazement as we pray, "speak to me, Lord."

THE NOVENA PRAYER

"Lord Jesus Christ, we worship you living among us in the sacrament of your body and blood. May we offer to our Father in heaven a solemn pledge of undivided love. May we offer to our brothers and sisters a life poured out in loving service of that kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

MASS ATTENDANCE DURING PROVINCE-WIDE EMERGENCY BRAKE & NEW REOPENING PLAN

The Provincial Government has extended the province-wide emergency brake until June 14, 2021, when stage 1 of the reopening plan begins. The changes will continue to affect Mass attendance in that we are only allowed ten (10) people per Mass, including Deacon Guy and Fr. Ernest. Stage 2 of the newly imposed 3-stage re-opening plan will allow indoor religious services, rites or ceremony gatherings at 15% capacity. Stage 2 is expected some 21 days after stage 1, but the new plan is also based on province-wide vaccination rates and improvements in key public health and health care indicators. In the meantime, we will do our best to ensure that those who have a mass intention scheduled will be given priority to attend that particular Mass. We encourage those who wish to attend Mass to please call or email the office (613-932-9616) to get on the list for the Mass you attend. Mass schedules will be done on a rotational basis.

SAFETY PROTOCOL

Please do not congregate at the doors of the church or in the parking lot. We asked you to go directly to your car without visiting with your fellow parishioners. Wear your face covering to cover the nose, mouth and chin and maintain a 6ft distance when entering or exiting the church. Sanitize your hands and sign the contact tracing sheet and go directly to a pew marked with the green tape and once seated, do not change pews. When exiting, leave the kneeler in the down position, maintain the 6ft rule and go directly to your cars.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Charles Lwanga and Companions – June 03

Charles Lwanga and his companions became Christians through the Catholic missions of the Missionaries of Africa (commonly known as the White Fathers). As a master of royal pages, Charles' predecessor, also a Christian, had censured King Mwanga of Uganda for his cruelty and immorality. The vengeful king, determined to stamp out Christianity, ordered Charles and the other young Christian pages put to death. About 100 died during the persecution. Within a year of these deaths, however, the number of Christians had significantly increased, and by 1890 was estimated to be ten thousand. The 22 Martyrs of Uganda died on June 03, 1886 and were canonized in 1964. Charles Lwanga has been declared patron of Catholic Action and black African youth.
