

MESSAGE FROM PATRONS OF ST. COLUMBAN FOUNDATION

Dear parishioners, on behalf of the Patrons of St. Columban Foundation, I wish to update you on the work of the Foundation and the <u>LIFT UP THE CROSS</u> project.

During the past 15 years, through your generosity, the Patrons of St. Columban Foundation have raised over \$820,000 for the stabilization and restoration of our historic St. Columban's Church. This includes \$51,132, which was raised last year. Much work has been done on essential capital repairs in recent years, but there is still more work to be done.

This year, our top priority is the <u>LIFT UP THE CROSS</u> project to raise the necessary funds to restore the church steeple and install a new cross. The present estimate for this project is \$130,000. We need your continued financial support to complete this project. All the funds that we receive this year from the Foundation Sunday collection, our annual concert in October, the Christmas Remembrances booklet and any bequests will be allocated to the <u>LIFT UP THE CROSS</u> project. We are also contacting potential major donors, individuals, businesses, organizations and those who wish to donate in memory of a family member to donate at the following levels: \$1,000, \$2,500, \$5,000, 10,000, \$25,000. Major donors will be recognized in the parish bulletin and on a donor wall plaque in the church. Donors can also donate on a weekly or monthly basis to reach their total donation.

This year, our Foundation Sunday weekend collection was to take place at the masses on May 8-9. However, with the latest provincial lockdown restricting attendance at mass to 10 persons, most parishioners will not be able to attend mass and make their donation with the special May 9 blue Foundation envelope in their box of envelopes. Nevertheless, you can still donate to the Foundation at this time by mailing your Foundation envelope to Patrons of St. Columban Foundation at 36 4th St., West, Cornwall, ON. K6J 2R6 or by dropping it off in the parish office mailbox. If you do not have a Foundation envelope, indicate on your envelope Foundation Donation. Cheques should be made payable to Patrons of St. Columban Foundation. The Foundation will issue income tax receipts. When we donate to the Foundation, we honour the memory of our ancestors who built this magnificent, soaring church 125 years ago and the memory of those who have maintained and restored it ever since, including the 1944 earthquake and the major fires in 1992 and 2002. MASS ATTENDANCE DURING NEW STAY-AT-HOME ORDER – STARTING APRIL 19, 2021

The Provincial Government has extended the stay-at-home order until May 20, 2021.
