In the gospel today, Jesus explains how we are to live if we want to inherit the Kingdom of God. Many of the actions—such as being poor in spirit or meek or merciful—are seen as signs of weakness, not as signs of power and strength. Yet Jesus promises that the kingdom belongs to those who live in these ways. Today, take a few minutes to think about each Beatitude.



In order to keep the community well informed about the Covid-19 pandemic and the measures taken to contain it as best as possible. Dr. Paul Roumeliotis. Medical Officer of Health for the Eastern Ontario Health Unit (EOHU) features regular short video columns on Facebook to answer any questions asked. We encourage you to take the time to watch these videos to stay up-to-date.

EMBS PENSION PLAN

The priests' pension plan annual collection will take place Sunday November 1. Last year's collection generated \$60,763. We are very appreciative of your concern for our welfare over the eight (8) years that we have had this collection. As the number of retired priests outnumber the active priests by a ratio of 2 to 1, it has made it difficult to increase the pension benefit. Continued low interest rates plus the fact that people are living longer have also delayed any increases. With your help, the monthly pension changed from \$750 to \$800 in 2014 and then to \$900 effective July 2020. With amalgamation taking place civilly likely next year, we are targeting to reach the level that Ottawa priests receive (\$1,125 per month) by having a further increase to \$1,000 as of January 2021. Through your generosity, we are hoping to be able to do so and thank you for your consideration. I wish to express my heartfelt gratitude to all of you for your generous response to our annual collection for the Priests' Pension Fund. Sincere thanks for the assistance that you provide to your elderly, retired clergy.

I know that the Lord who is infinitely generous with us all will reward you with an abundance of blessings and graces.
