THE NEW EVANGELIZATION - RIGHT WHERE WE LIVE!

For some months now, the clergy of our diocese (priests and deacons) have been receiving ongoing formation through the ministry of Catholic Christian Outreach. Quite recently, a number of laity from our parish and some from six other parishes in the diocese, have been introduced to and trained to facilitate small group discussion using newly developed, powerful and engaging videos produced to augment CCOs existing six week **Discovery** program.

In reflecting upon the official position and teaching of the Church, CCO cofounder Andre Regnier, says that: "Before there can be authentic and widespread engagement in evangelization we first need to recognize that we are dealing with a Catholic identity crisis. We need to know why and for what purpose we exist as a Church. We need to see evangelization not simply as something we do, but fundamentally as who we are ... Evangelization is not an optional activity for us. It is a necessary and urgent duty. To be Catholic means to be missionary - to be willing to reach out to others and share with them the Good News of salvation. As John Paul II so clearly understood, the purpose of evangelization is to renew the world through conversion to Christ. Unfortunately, for many Catholics, parish life does not inspire missionary activity."

All parishes should be missionary. It starts with changing the way we think about what it means to be Catholic. We are on the cusp of a great revolution - the new springtime of Christianity as John Paul II called it. This Catholic revolution does not demand a change in the Church's teachings. Nor will it be brought about merely through more retreats, conferences, or rallies. It is a call to change the way we think as Catholics, and to allow this new mindset to inform our actions. As John Paul II explained: "A radical conversion in thinking is required in order to become missionary. This radical new way of thinking will enhance our convictions, inspire our worship, and engage our people. It will provide courage, focus and commitment, which are crucial to the embodiment of our Catholic identity."

Reflecting upon a time when he was a younger man starting out in the world, Andre recounts: "I gave God permission to use me. He took me up on the offer." His future wife, Angele says that she promised God: "I will do anything You want me to do, say anything You want me to say, and go anywhere you want me to go."

The original purpose of Catholic Christian Outreach, their shared ministry, is to reach out to university students who have wandered away and bring them back to Christ and His Church. CCO staff then equip those students to go out and do the same for others. To the surprise of many, this movement has expanded across the country and around the world. CCO has 70 full-time lay missionaries working on campuses in Canada, the majority of whom consider this work their life vocation.

CCO has learned over the years that they cannot assume that Catholics know Christ - it is necessary for them to provide opportunity and environment for Catholics to encounter Him. After people have this personal encounter with the Lord they can begin to help them understand and live out the mission that they were given at Baptism. Increasingly CCO is being called upon to extend their ministry reach into Catholic parishes.

Soon we will have the opportunity to take the next step by participating in the first of these short courses. Please keep your eye on this bulletin - more info coming shortly! In the interim, please, let's each of us make this prayer ours: "Lord, I give You permission. Transform me. Work through me to reach others for your Kingdom. Amen."

POPE FRANCIS

ONE PERSON CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Pope Francis is proving that, in the power of the Holy Spirit, one humble person can reach many. His official visit to the United States has just come to its completion and many priests and others are continuing to report an increase in people returning to the Sacraments (sometimes entire families).

A priest in Michigan reports: "I had three calls yesterday from folks who are seeking to reconnect with the Church and who credit Pope Francis and his presence here in the USA with their desire."

A woman from Pittsburg shared: "By continual observation of his witness and the stoic witness of the Church in the face of the assault on marriage namely that marriage is between one man and one woman, my brother-in-law of 35 years who is 60+ years protestant, is entering into RCIA."
