# From the Pastor's Desk 5th Sunday of Lent – April 2nd

### God is my help

The name Lazarus means "God is my help". Jesus' parable about the poor man Lazarus, who died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom (Luke 16:19-31), ends with a warning: "If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead." Through Lazarus' sickness and subsequent death, God brought glory through his Son the Lord Jesus, who raised his friend from the dead in anticipation of his own death and resurrection. Our participation in the Lord's Supper in the Eucharist already gives us a foretaste of Jesus' transfiguration of our bodies.

Irenaeus, a second century church father states: "Just as bread that comes from the earth, after God's blessing has been invoked upon it, is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly: so too our bodies, which partake of the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of resurrection"(*Adv. Haeres. 4,18*).

#### SHARE LENT COLLECTION

Today this fifth Sunday of Lent, also called Solidarity Sunday, the Share Lent collection is taken to support the mission established by the Bishops of Canada 50 years ago in 1967 when they created Development and Peace - Caritas Canada, namely: to support socioeconomic projects and partners in the Global South in the pursuit of alternatives to unjust social, political and economic structures (international programs), and to educate Canadians about the causes of impoverishment of peoples in the Global South and mobilize actions for change (education and advocacy). 79% of the organisation's funds are allocated to international programs and 12 % to education and advocacy. The mission and work are inspired by the values of the Gospel, particularly "the preferential option for the poor." **Development** and Peace works in partnership with close to 150 local organizations in over 30 countries in the Global South who are empowering their communities to defend their rights, act for peace and promote their own development. We believe that the poor must be the authors of their own destiny and we support them in this endeavour. Programs address the root causes of poverty on the following issues: democracy and citizen participation, equality between men and women, food, natural resources, ecological justice, peace and humanitarian aid. For example, on peace Development and Peace advocates that without peace there can be no development. It is the foundation for building a better society and we believe in upholding human dignity, promoting dialogue and tolerance through common projects that are focused on community building. Therefore in the Middle East we are bringing together youth of different faiths to collaborate on joint projects which is helping to break down barriers and create understanding.
