### Repent and believe in the Gospel

What is the significance of Jesus spending 40 days and nights of solitude, prayer and fasting in the Judean wilderness? In the Old Testament 40 days was often seen as a significant period of testing and preparation for entering into a covenant relationship with God. In the days of Noah, God judged the earth and destroyed its inhabitants in a great flood because of their idolatry and total rejection of God. Noah and his family were spared because they obeyed God and took refuge in the ark for 40 days. When the flood subsided God made a covenant with Noah and promised that he would not destroy the human race again. Jesus came to fulfill that promise. We take the time of 40 days with Jesus, to be renewed and challenged!

**Prayers** for our lenten journey of prayer, almsgiving and fasting. Let us be generous in our contribution to the Share Lent collection and for our support for Development and Peace. Let peace reign in our hearts in our solidarity with those of Developing countries...

**Message for Lent from Pope Francis**: "Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer," the Pope said in his message, published Feb. 6. "If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew." At the Easter Vigil, we will light the Easter candle, he said, explaining how it symbolizes a "new fire," and will "slowly overcome the darkness and illuminate the liturgical assembly."

"May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds," he continued. "By listening to God's word and drawing nourishment from the table of the Eucharist, may our hearts be ever more ardent in faith, hope and love."

"In the Liturgy of the Word, Pope Francis remarks: in fact, the pages of the Bible stop being something written and become the living word, delivered by God himself," the pope said. As the readings are proclaimed, people in the pews should be silent and receptive, opening their hearts and minds to what is being said, not looking around or making small talk and criticizing what other people are wearing, he said. "We have to listen, open our hearts, because it is God himself who is speaking to us. So don't think about other things or talk about something else. Understood?" he asked the thousands of people gathered in St. Peter's Square.


