

PASTOR'S DESK

February 26, 2023 – First Sunday of Lent

"It is written: 'The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve." Matthew 4:10 Tempted between the riches and power of this world and service to God, Jesus chose service to His Father. If we wish to truly follow Jesus, we, too, must decide to turn away from worldly power and riches and put God at the center of our lives. Lent is our time to prune ourselves of earthly things, and develop and nurture heavenly things. Lent is time to repent and let go of the other "gods" we have put before God.

Pope Francis: Evangelizing is about showing Jesus, not talking about Jesus. How true! This heading in America Magazing caught my attention:

Are we on board? At a time when we are hearing about or seeing fewer people in church, there is more need to understand and implement the New Evangelization. Are we ready for change and/or what's coming? How can we engage folks to come back to church, or is that on the radar for you? The ministry of Mission and Discipleship is becoming more of a reality in parishes. I can think of at least six parishes where a lay person; having the background in this area is part of the Pastoral team. These themes are not drummed up by your pastor. They are a necessary reality to keep alive and yes create a vibrant community here at St Augustine parish. (Fr Frank)

Our Lenten journey is synodal

Pope Francis takes his inspiration from the Gospel account of the Transfiguration, proclaimed each year on the Second Sunday of Lent. As with the chosen disciples at the Transfiguration, Jesus "takes us with Him to a place apart" during the season of Lent. "Lenten penance," he writes, "is a commitment, sustained by grace, to overcoming our lack of faith and our resistance to following Jesus on the way of the cross." This requires effort, sacrifice, and concentration, which are also requirements for the Synodal Journey; and therefore, we can say that "our Lenten journey is 'synodal' since we make it together along the same path, as disciples of the one Master."
