

PASTOR'S DESK

February 27, 2022 – Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit." (LUKE 6:43)
Are you using your gifts in the way God intended? Have you asked God how He would like you to use them? Do you compare yourself to others and complain about what you don't have instead of being thankful for what you do have? God gives each of us unique gifts and a unique plan. Listen to how God is calling you to use your gifts, to bear good fruit, for the glory of His name.

Liturgy guidelines and observations:

You may notice that in the Orthodox churches; standing is a common posture. In many areas of worship there are no kneelers, pews or chairs. These are things we take for granted in our own worship space. Standing at certain parts of the mass is now a common place in our Liturgy. You will note there was an addition a few years ago, I think it was in the fall of 2011, to remain standing during Communion (procession). Following Communion as meditation, we are invited to then kneel in thankful prayer. While Communion is being distributed, **the people remain standing**, as one body, just as they do during the Gospel. When people return to their place, they continue to remain standing. This is a universal requirement, for the whole Catholic Church of the Latin Rite. On the other hand, the faithful should sit during the readings before the Gospel and the Responsorial Psalm and for the Homily and during the Preparation of the Gifts at the Offertory; and, if appropriate, they may sit or kneel during the period of sacred silence after Communion.

Beyond the Hour on Sunday:

It seems clear that there is very little response and attendance at our monthly Refuge night on the third Friday of each month, at our weekday masses and at our penance services. The main focus seems to be on Sunday Mass only! Can this change? What is happening and is this a new reality at St Augustine's? It's interesting to note there are many visitors at our weekday masses, who are not here at our Sunday mass. When we are looking ahead to a normalcy after the "Pandemic" how are these questions going to be resolved or looked at?

NORMS OF LENTEN OBSERVANCE

The **liturgical season of Lent begins Wed.**, **March 2**nd. The following are guidelines of Lenten observance.

• Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence from meat. Fridays are days of abstinence.

Fasting binds all persons who have completed their 18th birthday through those who have completed their 59th year, unless prevented by poor health. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids may be taken.

Abstinence binds all persons who have completed their 14th birthday, unless prevented by poor health. In the Archdiocese of Ottawa, the consumption of meat is not allowed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.
