

From the Pastor's Desk

3rd Sunday of Lent (Sunday, March 19th)

A spring of water welling up to eternal life

What is the point of Jesus' exchange with the Samaritan woman about water? Water in the arid land was scarce. Jacob's well was located in a strategic fork of the road between Samaria and Galilee. One can live without food for several days, but not without water. Water is a source of life and growth for all living things. When rain came to the desert, the water transformed the wasteland into a fertile field. The kind of water which Jesus spoke about was living, running, fresh, pure water. Fresh water from a cool running stream was always preferred to the still water one might find in a pool or reservoir. When the Israelites complained about lack of water in the wilderness, God instructed Moses to strike the rock and a stream of fresh living water gushed out (Exodus17:6). Even though the Israelites did not trust God to care for them in the wilderness, God, nonetheless gave them abundant water and provision through the intercession of his servant Moses.

Development and Peace - Caritas Canada has been working with the Congolese Catholic Church since the 1970s, more recently to encourage citizen participation and ensure a fair electoral process starting with the first democratic elections in the DRC in 2006. The DRC is blessed with abundant natural wealth (mines, forests, water, earth), yet, due to foreign exploitation, corruption and poor governance, the country ranks second last on the Human Development Index (HDI). In the last ten years, DRC has experienced horrific violence, with various factions seeking to seize power and exercise control over the nation's vast mineral wealth. Development and Peace supports initiatives to promote peace and foster greater citizen participation in the democracybuilding process by putting in place civic education activities and creating community radio networks, for example in Katanga province (Lubumbashi, Likasi and Kamina). Cécile Kazadi, a woman from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, explains why community radio is an essential tool for women in dealing with sexual violence. "Thanks to RCK radio, our lives have changed a lot. We are now aware of our rights. Listening to RCK has opened our eyes. For example rape is no longer a taboo subject in our community. Today, when a young girl is raped, we [...] go directly to the police and seek justice."
