

That like the man born blind, we will allow Jesus to open our eyes and hearts to His will and bring more men and women to respond to His call to serve Him and His Church as priests, deacons and in the consecrated life.

I entered in and saw with the eye of my soul, the unchangeable Light, very different from earthly lights. It was above my mind but not the way oil is above water or heaven above the earth. It was superior because it made me, and I inferior because I was made by it. Those who know the truth know this light, and those who know it know eternity - It is charity that knows it." Women have always been at the heart of the work of Development and Peace - Caritas Canada in Indonesia. In 2005, Development and Peace actively responded to the Indian Ocean tsunami, particularly in the region of Banda Aceh, where it implemented a long-term reconstruction program that strengthened communities, improved their living conditions and created resilience to future disasters. A large part of the program focuses on the island of Sulawesi, where mining interests and the exploitation of other natural resources are threatening farming and indigenous communities and the environment. Development and Peace also supports national organizations in promoting a culture of democracy by the monitoring of human rights violations and support to independent journalists, as well as strengthening equality between men and women through establishment of local women's associations. There are many barriers that keep women from entering the work force. Only about 50% of Indonesian women participate in the labourforce. The challenges are even greater for women with disabilities. Discrimination and inaccessibility prevents women with disabilities from receiving an education or entering into the workforce. These women face greater poverty and exclusion. Development and Peace support The Indonesian Women's Coalition for Justice and Democracy (KPI) as it works to improve conditions for all women in Indonesian society, including women with disabilities. Risya is a 22 year old Indonesian woman blind since adolescence. Thanks to a workshop in journalism offered by the Association of Independent Journalists (AJI) a Development and Peace partner, she is now using her blog to write about discrimination faced by women with disabilities and encourage others to believe in their potential. AJI has offered workshops to 170 women. Now they can make their voices heard! The Fifth Sunday of Lent, next Sunday, is Solidarity Sunday.
