#### The foolish will miss heaven's wedding feast

The last day's themes of the liturgical year challenge us about 'readiness'. There are three Sunday's left for us to ponder future realities. Are you missing out on what's most important in life? Being unprepared can lead to unnecessary trouble and even disaster! What good is a life-jacket left on the shore when the boat is sinking? Jesus' story of ten single ladies waiting for a wedding procession in the middle of the night (*Matthew 25:1-13*) seems strange to most westerners today. But Jesus' audience knew all too well how easily this could happen to them.

**Financial challenges** are going to be a reality for a while here in the parish. We need to get the message out to parishioners about this. Parish Pastoral Council met Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>, to discuss this with the chair of Finance Council; reviewing various areas of challenges we face as a parish financially. I feel it is important to communicate how the collections have been going down the last 3 to 4 years. Many factors have contributed to this. There is no question how the loss of long term parishioners is evident and how it has impacted the parish. We have benefited from their service and financial contribution over the years. Over these past few months, I have spoken about the importance of "stewardship" in homilies and communicated how the "value" of giving of time, talent and treasure is Gospel centered. I was surprised how little reaction I got with sharing those homilies and videos; at least to me personally! A basic question: Do people see and understand the importance of "financial giving," or is there still an attitude "oh it shouldn't bother me 'the church is rich anyway'".

How does this impact our Pastoral priorities, goals, initiative for the New Evangelization that all parishes are to make priority; which was brought home to us as pastors on our annual retreat (Oct. 23-27). Emphasis on the promotion for a "dynamic Catholic parish." How does this affect our budgeting role and implementation ie. Alpha, Sacramental Preparation, Education areas...? Where do we identify important budget items for 2018? Are we ready to move away from a maintenance driven parish... to a call for Mission, missionary, building the kingdom! All of this was discussed at our recent Parish Pastoral Council meeting Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>; reviewing some serious budgetary items! Fundraising efforts are underway; if you would like to help in this area please let us know.

**Liturgy items:** there is need for <u>more Greeters</u> at our church doors. Hospitality is an important part of parish life. There is a need for a Lector's workshop and importance of Proclamation. We are blessed with a number of Eucharistic ministers and interested to note not many partake of the Chalice at Communion. We had a recent video expressing well "how to "receive Communion; review practices and bad habits! All of us should be aware of parishioners who could offer service and ministry for Sunday Liturgy.

For the New Evangelization there are three areas that are crucial, moving from a maintenance run church to one of mission and missionary ... \*hospitality/greeters \*music ministry \*preaching/homily I believe we cover all three!
