

NOV. 26TH – OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Come...inherit the kingdom prepared for you

Do you allow the love of Christ, who is your Lord and King, to rule in your heart? Augustine of Hippo (354-430 A.D.) said, "Essentially, there are two kinds of people, because there are two kinds of love. One is holy, the other is selfish. One is subject to God; the other endeavors to equal Him." Jesus came not only to fulfill the law of righteousness (Leviticus 19), but to transform it through his unconditional love and mercy towards us.

The Lord Jesus proved his love for us by offering up his life on the cross as the atoning sacrifice for our sins. His death brings freedom and life for us - freedom from fear, selfishness, and greed - and new abundant life in the Holy Spirit who fills our hearts with the love of God (Romans 5:5). Do you allow God's love to purify your heart and transform your mind to think, act, and love others as the Lord Jesus has taught through word and example?

In preparation for Synod on Youth and young Adults next fall 2018; there is some sobering stats: According to the Pew Research Center, the number of religiously disaffiliated or "Nones" in the United States has risen rapidly from an estimated 36.6 million people in 2007 to an estimated 55.8 million in 2014. Approximately 35% of millennials (the generation born between 1981 and 1996) are "Nones" and may identify as atheists, agnostics or believe "nothing in particular."

"Mass is for the Eucharist, not pictures," Pope says November 8, 2017

VATICAN - On Wednesday a fiery Pope Francis chastised those who spend Mass talking to others, looking at their phone or even taking pictures during papal liturgies, saying these are distractions that take focus away from the "heart of the Church," which is the Eucharist.

"WHAT IS HAPPENING?" I am quite concerned how there is very few parishioners partaking of adoration, morning mass, Alpha, and Refuge We attract a number of visitors through the website and Facebook, however, I'm wondering what more can be done to attract parishioners; or is this a concern? This will be a great topic for our next parish Pastoral Council meeting! You may note that every weekday morning the church is open at 7:30 a.m., offering Holy hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (for me this is a great way for prayer). Morning Mass has changed back to 9:00 a.m. for six months (there is not much change in numbers). Alpha has about 40 participants (including team) half are outside the parish. This is a great way of understanding the basics of our Christian faith and invitation to go deeper. Refuge evening is every third Friday of month at 7:00 p.m. (Holy Hour of Adoration, praise and worship, silence and speaker.
