

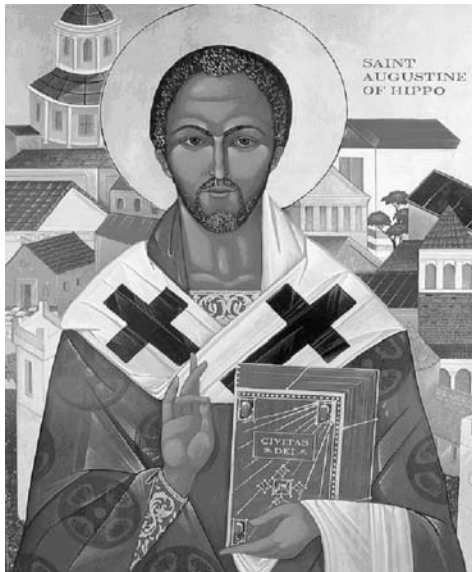

From the Pastor's Desk

Sunday (Nov. 6):

Last days of the Liturgical year

Is your life earth-bound or heaven-bound? In the Gospel, the Sadducees had one big problem - they could not conceive of heaven beyond what they could see with their naked eyes! Aren't we often like them? We don't recognize spiritual realities because we try to make heaven into an earthly image. The Sadducees came to Jesus with a test question to make the resurrection look ridiculous. The Sadducees, unlike the Pharisees, did not believe in immortality, nor in angels or evil spirits. Their religion was literally grounded in an earthly image of heaven.

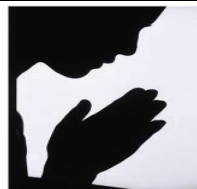

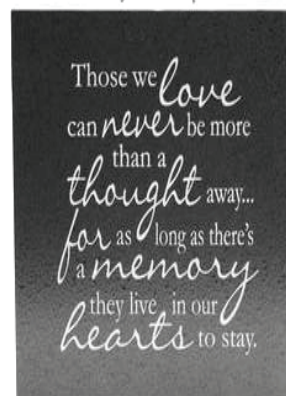

WORKSHOP ON THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH AND YOUCAT

welcome to attend.

The Workshop on Catechism of the Catholic Church revolves around three basic questions that are asked on this topic. What is CCC? Why CCC? How does one apply CCC to Christian life? Along with CCC, the relevance of Youcat also will incorporate in the workshop. The first question provides answers for a proper understanding of the content of CCC and Youcat. The second question looks at the reasons and relevance of CCC and Youcat. Finally, the third issue deals with the few guidelines to implement these books in our Christian context. The session will be more interactive with the help of multimedia.

Ruling on Cremated remains from the Vatican: Catholics are forbidden from keeping the ashes of cremated loved ones at home, scattering them, dividing them between family members or turning them into mementoes, the Vatican has ruled.

Ashes must be stored in a sacred place, such as a cemetery, according to instructions disclosed at a press conference in Rome on Tuesday. (Oct. 25) (Further info. is available on this topic: google vatican news or Catholic news service).

GLOBAL WARMING AND REFUGEES:

In his September 1, 2016 message on the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, Pope Francis stated, "Global warming continues, due in part to human activity: 2015 was the warmest year on record, and 2016 will likely be warmer still. This is leading to ever more severe droughts, floods, fires and extreme weather events. Climate change is also contributing to the heart-rending refugee crisis. The world's poor, though least responsible for climate change, are most vulnerable and already suffering its impact." Regarding the Paris Climate Agreement, Pope Francis further stated that "governments are obliged to honour the commitments that they made", and "it is up to citizens to insist that this happen, and indeed to advocate for even more ambitious goals."
