At the Easter Vigil and the two Masses on Easter Sunday I thanked everyone involved in making the Holy Week liturgies the beautiful, inspiring and sacred events that they were. Nonetheless, I want to do the same with these few lines. Many hands and voices were involved in making certain that everything ran smoothly. There were several who worked "behind the scenes" as well. I heard many compliments from visitors and parishioners alike. A big Thank You to all involved. Happy Easter! Jesus rose from the dead; He is no longer in the tomb. By His death and resurrection we can have eternal life in His presence. Alleluia!

Sacramental "quick fix"

More and more we are encountering older children who have not received the Sacraments of Initiation. Normally children are baptized in infancy upon the faith of their parents. When this does not happen it imposes a challenge in terms of teaching the faith. Some parents are presenting their children aged 7, 8, 9, 10, etc. for baptism, first communion, and confirmation and are expecting, what I refer to as a "quick fix". Often this request comes in the spring of the year when catechism classes are nearing an end. Perhaps they hear from family members or friends about their child, soon to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation. This leads the parent to think about their own child who still has not received the sacrament or sacraments of initiation. Obviously, we are speaking about individuals who are not registered parishioners and who attend Sunday Mass only occasionally, at best. These parents then want a "quick fix" to their dilemma. Unfortunately, there are no "quick fixes" for this dilemma. Children, over the age of 7 must be instructed in the faith prior to reception of the sacrament/s. The Sacraments are about conversion or a change of mind set. Some people do have a dramatic conversion such as St. Paul had on the road to Damascus, however for most of us, conversion is a process which requires time and preparation. Then the question of who will instruct these children of different ages. This can be compared to a child who is perhaps aged 11 and has never attended normal school. Can that child be placed in the class of his/her academic year, namely grade six, unable to read, write or count, etc.? Of course not. Also, can a child, aged 15 be placed in the same class as a child aged 7? In the past, when this type of instruction involved one child I would prepare the child myself. However, as already mentioned, this is becoming more of a phenomenon, involving more and more children. The parents are usually not much help because they, themselves are weak in their own faith. I write this, simply to make parishioners aware of this on-going and ever-growing problem. If there are any parishioners who are willing to teach on a one-one basis, over a longer length of time, please let me, your pastor know.
