From the Pastor's desk:

World Day of Prayer for Vocations

On Sunday, April 22, 2018, we are commemorating the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. On that day we are going to pray in a particular way as a diocesan Church at St. Mary's Cathedral at 7 pm. Archbishop Gagnon will preside over the Holy Hour and we are all invited to attend and unite our voices in asking God to stir the hearts of young people to respond to His call to "come, follow me". In our present world of noise and self-centredness, it is difficult to discern the inviting voice of the Good Shepherd and even more difficult to respond. Our family and friends may often not be supportive of the call of Jesus because they have other worldly dreams for us that involve the god of money, pleasure and popularity. Please join the vocational discerners and myself at the cathedral on April 22nd and let us pray for an openness of heart toward religious vocations

Sacramental Preparation

During Holy Week many people who do not attend Mass on a regular basis appear on the scene. They read the bulletin and hear about First Communion and realize that they have a child that should have had First Communion a few years ago but because they don't have their child in catechism the child missed. Now they think that they can squeeze their child into receiving First Communion which is scheduled to happen in a couple of weeks. Well, I can assure those parents that this is not going to happen. Recently, a mother took the Sacred Host during communion time and then proceeded to break the Host in two in order to give half to her daughter who, obviously had not yet received her First Communion. This denotes a lack of understanding on what we as Catholics believe and practice regarding reception of the Holy Eucharist. The same is true for the many who do not genuflect when they enter and leave their pew. It saddens me greatly to see this lack of acknowledgement and respect for Jesus present in the Eucharist. However, all is not lost. I notice that a lot of "older" children coming with their parents at communion time and not receiving the Eucharist. So, I am wondering how many actually fit into this category? If there are sufficient, perhaps we can offer some preparation classes. If you have a child in this category, then speak to me, to Lynda McCorquodale or phone the church office. This will help us determine a more exact number.

Bishop Athanasius Schneider

At the end of May, Bishop Athanasius Schneider, who is the auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of St. Mary in Astana, Kazakhstan, will be in Winnipeg to receive the Regina Sacratissimi Rosarii Award. The Gala will take place on May 30, 2018, at 6 pm, at the Fort Garry Hotel and the award will be presented by Dr. Peter Kwasniewski from Wyoming Catholic College. Archbishop Richard Gagnon has asked me to allow Bishop Schneider to offer Mass here at St. Anthony's Parish on May 30 & 31. The two Masses will be in the morning, but the time has not been finalized. Everyone is welcome to attend these two Masses.

Development & Peace

"The Bishops of Canada have been made aware of a recent appraisal of such partners of the Catholic Organization Development & Peace and have become concerned that a sizable number of them have practices and positions which conflict with Catholic moral and social teachings, such as respect for the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death. As a result of this current review of Development & Peace partnerships the Archdiocese of Winnipeg, along with the other dioceses in 33Western Canada, is temporarily withholding the 2018 S\hare Lent donations. These funds are being withheld until such a time as we receive assurance from Development & Peace that its partner agencies comply with Catholic moral and social teaching and with the criteria of Caritas International, of which Development & Peace is a member. The temporary withholding of funds underscores the seriousness of the Bishops' concerns and the need for open transparency and accountability." (exerts from a letter written to all parishes in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg by our Archbishop Richard Gagnon). The entire letter is posted on the bill board.

Archdiocesan Statistics For the Year of 2017

Some people are interested in statistics, so I include the following sacramental stats for the year of 2017: Baptisms 1,422. Confirmations 886. First Communions 1078. Marriages 181. In comparison with the previous year of 2016, all the numbers increased except for marriages which were down by 30. This is indicative of our secular society which unfortunately influences the Church as well.


