Introduction To Penitential Rite: Today's Gospel tells the familiar story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. The experience of having the deepest mysteries of their faith explained to them by a stranger is capped when they recognize the very Lord they'd been mourning. We, too, must learn to see Christ in the many ways he comes to us today.

Acts 2:14, 22b-28 In the first reading, Peter preaches to the crowds celebrating Pentecost in Jerusalem. He affirms that Jesus of Nazareth is the Lord of life.

<u>1 Peter 1:17-21</u> In the second reading, Peter recalls that God has ransomed us from sin through his Son. Thus, we are able to honor God through the way we live.

<u>Luke 24:13-35</u> In the Gospel, the risen Lord appears in the form of a stranger to two disciples. He reveals himself to them in breaking open the Scriptures and in the breaking of the bread.
