Collection for the Holy Land

Pope Francis announced that the collection for the Holy Land, normally collected on Good Friday, will be moved close to the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the weekend of September 12 & 13 due to the COVID-10 pandemic on Good Friday. The funds collected so far will be added to that total.

Brief comment from the CCCB President on the 1 May 2020 Marian Consecration

Church in Canada - "To consecrate means to entrust into someone's care something important and precious. In this case, we entrust ourselves, our families, communities, all those affected by COVID-19 and indeed our entire country to the Mother of God. We believe in the power of prayer and especially intercessory prayer. At this difficult time of pandemic, we ask the Virgin Mary to pray for us and to pray with us to the Lord so that, through her intercession, we may obtain from God the necessary graces, the wisdom and the courage, the insights and peace of heart to respond responsibly and with faith to the challenges at hand. Furthermore, May is the month dedicated in a special way to the Mother of Christ. We believe that she is, in a spiritual but real sense, our mother too. Coming to an Easter Faith

Archdiocese of Winnipeg - "Although the chocolate bunnies may long be gone, it is still Easter. As Catholics, we hold Easter to be so important that we celebrate the eight-day period that begins Easter morning as though a single day, and recognize the season for a full fifty days. During this time, the liturgical calendar focuses on the resurrection accounts and stories from the Acts of the Apostles that chronicle the life of the early Church. These stories are so familiar that it is easy to overlook the magnitude of an event so great that it changed the way we mark time. Our inability to participate in the Triduum services this year, while difficult, has given us an opportunity to hear the news of the resurrection in much the same way as the first recipients."
